Cana staff are always mindful of the effect of transitions on students & put actions in place to support students in managing them. Our staff have established a routine for helping students to transition successfully to the learning space & will review this regularly with all students.

Paying attention to transitions is very important. Students can struggle to regulate themselves when transitions occur. This inability to independently regulate emotions & cope can cause learning disruptions for themselves & others.

### Some transitions include:

- from home to school & school to home
- from subject to subject,
- from outside to inside, inside to outside
- from one grade level to the next grade level
- from one learning setting to another learning setting, e.g. specialist subjects, excursions, Kinder to Prep, Year 6 to Year 7

### Some significant transitions are:

- Preschoolers entering their first (prep) year in the school system
- All students 'stepping up' to a new grade level
- Year 6 leaving Cana & moving into year 7

## Transitions need to be managed well because they can be a source of emotional upheaval.

The amygdala (small part of the brain), is a major processing centre for emotions. It also links our emotions to many other brain abilities, especially memories, learning & our senses. When it doesn't work as it should, it can cause or contribute to disruptive feelings & symptoms (e.g. tummy ache) which can affect learning. An 'amygdala hijack' occurs when any strong emotion — anger, fear, anxiety, or even extreme excitement — impairs the prefrontal cortex, the part of the brain that regulates rational thought. Additionally, senior students of primary school age also undergo puberty, making transitions a particularly confusing, stressful & anxiety provoking time for some young people.

For Year 6 students entering secondary school many children may also feel sad or angry about leaving their current school & the positive relationships they've established with teachers & friends.

## Common concerns when students transition include:

- losing old friends and making new friends
- being bullied
- dealing with different educators
- new homework expectations
- getting lost
- getting to class on time

- remembering what books and other equipment is needed for each class
- following a timetable

Some students & parents view transitions as exciting times & look forward to new changes & new beginnings. Other students & parents can feel apprehensive & view this time as a time of loss, a milestone passing & letting go of the familiar & predictable environment, relationships & routines.

Positive transitions are vital to allay the effects of the 'amygdala hijack' & to support students' wellbeing. Purposeful planning supports students to form relationships, learn new routines, feel a sense of connection and belonging in the new setting & helps to free up the brain for future learning success.

# At Cana our teachers engage in many practices to support successful transitions. These are just a few:

- Kinder visits
- Pre-prep program
- Reading and/or writing transition statements
- Meetings with secondary school staff
- Providing students with opportunities to visit secondary schools/experience secondary school life, e.g. attending school productions
- Buddy program to build connections
- Transition/orientation/step up day
- Engaging in handover time where important information is passed from one teacher to the next including kinder to school & Year 6 to Year 7
- Learning routines, rules and structures (especially in Term 1)
- "Meet & Greets" with parents
- Getting to know you games/icebreakers
- Finding out about students' strengths and challenges
- Social stories
- Focussing on building executive functioning skills, e.g. being responsible for packing & unpacking bags, following 'ready to learn' routines, learning to follow a timetable,
- Talking about the transitions in preceding months or weeks & encouraging students to ask questions
- Teaching social emotional lessons that focus on emotions, coping skills & drawing on help networks

As the first educator of your child, there are many things you can do to support your child to have a smooth transition. Some of these include:

The Australian parenting website <u>www.raisingchildren.net.au</u> suggests easing the transition by preparing children practically and emotionally.

Please work in partnership with us by investing time in reading, preparing for and talking about managing transitions with your child. This helps to set your child up for learning success, better emotional regulation, greater capacity to cope with challenges & contributes overall to better mental health!

# Works notification





# Works in the area this November

We're making the Sunbury Line level crossing free in 2025, a year ahead of schedule, removing eight dangerous and congested level crossings to improve safety, reduce congestion and run more trains, more often.

#### What we're doing

Over the coming month we'll begin to construct the new road bridge deck and continue works on the new shared use path.

During this time, we'll:

- Continue to construct the foundations for the new road bridge and shared use path, including piling.
- Relocate and install essential services, including drainage and public lighting.
- · Begin asphalting in sections along the new Calder Park Drive road bridge.
- · Install concrete road barriers and guardrail along the new road alignment.
- Landscaping along the new road bridge embankments.

To get the job done, there will be road and pedestrian disruptions in your area.

Impact	Works and disruptions
Road	<ul> <li>In November, reduced speed limits, intermittent lane closures and traffic management will be in place. Increased travel times are expected.</li> <li>During this time, we'll deliver and install large bridge beams and begin constructing the new road bridge deck.</li> </ul>
Pedestrian	<ul> <li>To safely relocate existing services including public lighting, there will be a pedestrian detour on the corner of Calder Park Drive and Manchester Driveat times until late 2025.</li> <li>Please see overleaf of the pedestrian detour map.</li> </ul>
24 hour works	<ul> <li>To reduce impacts, we'll be working around the clock to deliver seven bridge beams from <b>9pm Monday 25 November to 7am Tuesday 26 November</b>.</li> <li>We anticipate impacts to be low, however you may experience increased light and noise impacts at times.</li> </ul>

#### What to expect

- Traffic management including lane closures and reduced speed limits at times.
- Increased construction noise, light and vibration nearby. We aim to minimise impacts where possible.
- Machinery and oversized equipment in the area, including trucks, cranes and earth moving equipment.
- Out of hours work may be required at times. We will contact impacted properties ahead of works with more information.
- Our general working hours are Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm and Saturday 7am to 5pm.

#### **PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEES**

When transferring school fee payments to the Cana school bank account, please ensure to include your family ID number with surname as the reference.

Each family has been provided with a unique 6 digit ID number that clearly identifies each family. Use of the Family ID as the reference ensures the owner of the payment for allocation and provision of receipt. This is particularly important in the event that the person making a school fee payment has a different surname to the surname listed on the school fee account.

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# The Child Safe Standards

The safety of each child at Cana is of the utmost importance. It is our duty of care to ensure each child feels safe within all environments including school, home, and the community.

To comply with the <u>Ministerial Order No. 1359 – Implementing the Child Safe Standards</u>, Cana is required to meet the Child Safe Standards 1-11. Below is an outline of each Child Safe standard. More information on each standard can be found here: <u>The 11 Child Safe Standards</u>

<u>Standard 1</u>: To establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued.

<u>Standard 2:</u> Child safety and wellbeing are embedded in organisational leadership, governance, and culture.

<u>Standard 3:</u> Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.

<u>Standard 4:</u> Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.

Standard 5: Equity is upheld, and diverse needs respected in policy and practice.

<u>Standard 6:</u> People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.

Standard 7: Processes for complaints and concerns are child focused.

<u>Standard 8</u>: Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills, and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.

<u>Standard 9:</u> Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.

Standard 10: Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved.

<u>Standard 11:</u> Policies and procedures document how the school is safe for children and young people.

In future editions of the newsletter, each Child Safe Standard will be explored in further detail with examples of how it is implemented at Cana.
