## Update on the Shape of Cana in 2021

As 2021 has brought more enrolments to Cana, we have needed to plan for further development and improvement at the school. We have been working towards implementing the following measures, which were outlined at the end of last year.

- Implementing new 'Adventure Playgrounds' for junior, middle and senior age groups.
- Providing seating areas – this is a joint goal with the School Fundraising Committee.
- Acquiring more sports/external play equipment.
- Developing a Master Plan – proposed additional classrooms and improved facilities, inclusive of indoor toilets. (A collaborative process has been undertaken with contributions from staff, parents and students).

Cana has applied for a State and Federal Government Grant for the building of new classrooms for stage 1 of our Master Plan. We anticipate finding out by the end of June/July whether this application is successful. Fingers crossed!



## OFF-Site Parking Responsibilities

We have been inundated with complaints about our families disregarding driving compliance condition and disrespecting road rules. Please ensure that you adhere to the following road rules:

- **Do Not** block or park in neighbouring driveways
- **Do Not** double park. Even if it is for a few seconds.
- Only those persons with **DISABLED stickers** are permitted to park in the disabled parking bays at front of school.
- **Do Not** park on people's nature strips.

## On-Site Parking Responsibilities

- **CAR PARK GATES:** The entrance to the school car park is the gate at the front of the school. The back car park gate is an **EXIT ONLY**.
- **REVERSE PARKING AT ALL TIMES:** To ensure a smooth exit during pickup times, please reverse into the parking spaces in our car parks rather than driving in forwards.
- **DRIVEWAYS MUST REMAIN CLEAR AT ALL TIMES:** Please do not park in the driveway while the gates are closed as doing so blocks OshClub employees from entering the school.
- **NO CHILD MAY WALK TO CARS (At the Basketball Courts) ALONE.**
- **A 5 km/h SPEED LIMIT APPLIES IN THE CAR PARK.**

**PLEASE DO NOT ENTER THE SCHOOL BEFORE 3PM.** (Sometimes visitors or staff may need to enter or leave the school earlier than 3PM but this does not permit anyone else to enter the school earlier than 3PM, other than OSHClub staff).

## School Ground Responsibilities

Please use appropriate walkway to drop off or collect your children from classrooms. The **front of the school is not a walk way to the Prep building**. This is an unsafe and unsupervised area.

Access to this area of the school is only permitted while students are dropping off or collecting their bikes for travel to and from the school.



**Skoolbag is our new digital platform:**

If one or more of your children is going to be absent from school, arrive late or leave early, please make sure to let the school know in advance. The roll is submitted at 9:00 AM each day. Therefore, to minimise and prevent double-handling of the school roll, we request that these notifications be submitted prior to the 8:45 AM start time each day whenever possible.

Parents who have been part of our Cana community in previous years will be familiar with our school app and its absentee notification function. Skoolbag, our new school app, now has forms to support absentee, late arrival and early departure notifications as well. Please also remember that if an unwell child is absent for longer than initially expected, we request that additional absent notifications are sent on subsequent days to cover these absences as well.

## CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

### Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible\* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two;
  - a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the *State Concessions Act 2004*, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
  - b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
  - c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

\* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: [www.education.vic.gov.au/csef](http://www.education.vic.gov.au/csef)

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

### Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (29 January 2018) or term two (16 April 2018).

## PAYMENT AMOUNTS

### CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: [www.education.vic.gov.au/csef](http://www.education.vic.gov.au/csef)

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents so please register your interest at the school.

## HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

### NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2018 closes on 29 June, 2018.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.

We're being jolted into sharp awareness again, aren't we, with news of COVID cases in Queensland and NSW. As we move into the central feasts of our year – Holy Thursday-Good Friday-Easter – I grimly remember our experience of Holy Week 2020: the only people allowed in our churches were the 'celebrant team and the technician', a total of five. With numbers still limited this year – 170 in our churches – it is still a grim experience, isn't it!

Our people want to gather in Holy Week-Easter prayer, thanksgiving, and worship. Once the essential bookings were opened, all availability in our churches was booked out. The Ceremonies will be streamed - go to 'sheparish' on YouTube and Facebook: Holy Thursday at 7pm onwards, Good Friday at 3pm onwards, Easter Vigil (Saturday night) at 7pm onwards.

An opportunity that still exists for gathering over these days is our procession of **Stations of the Cross on Good Friday morning, at 11am, on 'the oval' beside Sacred Heart church (St Albans).**

To allow this: ***bookings are essential; you will be 'signed in' as you arrive; there will be sanitisers in many places, and 'marshals' with reminders to maintain the appropriate social distancing.***

## CATHOLIC ARCHDIOCESE OF MELBOURNE

30 March 2021

Dear Friends,

I realise we are still in fairly volatile times and that things can change rapidly but it seems as though we will be able to gather face to face in our communities to celebrate Holy Week this year.

A sense of the deprivation that we all shared last year came to me as we celebrated the Palm Sunday liturgy this week, in particular in the reading of the Passion. The missing year of 2020 may serve to accentuate the centrality of Holy Week to our Christian identity and life.

There is no doubt that the emergence of a pandemic disrupted our usual lives and certainties. In the past twelve months many people have lived in fear and isolation. In parts of the world, death rates have soared. Certainly, it has not been all bad and many good things continued to happen over the last year, there were even some benefits that came out of lockdown as people had time to recalibrate their priorities and figure out just what is most important in life. Nevertheless, the overall sense of fear and isolation that characterised the past year has made a significant impact on our lives and on the community. In a certain way things can never be the same again and we are all too aware that we are not returning to business as usual.

In the Archdiocese, too, we face some particular challenges as to how we continue to bring good news into the lives of our people and communities. The challenge around the number of priests that we have available to fill vacant parishes for example, is emerging as a daily lived reality.

Over the coming twelve months and beyond we need to face in to this issue and together with our people to imagine new ways to create vibrant and viable, life-giving communities.

Archbishop Comensoli, in his recent Patrick Oration outlined succinctly the challenge that confronts us:

*"We need to face into this perhaps uncomfortable truth. As I read recently, "We are built for a church that no longer exists, and we have an infrastructure for a Church that no longer exists." Again, Pope Francis has been quite explicit about this, calling on local Churches not to struggle to hold on to what it has left behind but to see itself as a mission church moving outward. (cf. EG.28; 33) This is going to require a renewal of the lay apostolic life."*

While the prospect of change can bring with it a sense of uncertainty, grief and fear we remain a people of hope and this season of Holy Week and Easter leading up to the feast of Pentecost accentuates that the Church has always and will always need to adapt to meet the needs of the People of God and the world.

May I take this opportunity to wish you and your parish communities a blessed and Holy Easter.

## Collection Notice for parents/guardians

### 2021 Student Residential Address and Other Information

The Australian Government Department of Education, Skills and Employment (the department) would like to advise you that a request has been made for your child's school to provide residential address and other information as required under the *Australian Education Regulation 2013* (Cth).

The school is required to provide the department with the following information about each student at the school:

- Names and residential addresses of students' parent(s) and/or guardian(s)
- Student residential address (excluding student names)
- Whether the student is a primary or secondary student (education level)
- Whether the student is boarding or a day student (boarding status).

Your child's school generates a **unique and unidentifiable** record number for each student record. The number is **only** used by the school for this collection. **It is not allowed to be used for any other purpose.** The number indicates to the department that each record provided is for one student.

#### Purpose of the collection

The Student Residential Address and Other Information Collection (the Collection) informs Australian Government school education policy and helps ensure funding for non-government schools is based on need.

The information collected will be used to inform school funding calculations. It is combined with data held by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) to calculate a non-government school community's anticipated capacity to contribute to the costs of schooling.

From 2020, a new measure of capacity to contribute, the Direct Measure of Income (DMI), was introduced. The DMI is based on the median income of parents or guardians of students at a non-government school using data collected through the Collection. #### Use and disclosure of personal information

**Your personal information is protected by law** under the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth) (Privacy Act). Personal information is information or an opinion about an identifiable individual. Personal information includes an individual's name and contact details.

Any use or disclosure of your personal information must occur in accordance with Privacy Act and the *Australian Education Act 2013* and *Australian Education Regulation 2013*.

Your personal information provided to the department through the Collection may be:

- disclosed to the ABS for the purposes of capacity to contribute calculations and analysis as a part of the Multi-Agency Data Integration Project (MADIP). Further information about MADIP can be found on the [MADIP page](#) on the ABS website.
- disclosed to a contracted auditor where the department may from time to time, carry out an audit of a school's submission to the Collection. The contracted auditor compares the school's submission with the student enrolment information held by the school and will not use the information for any other purpose
- disclosed to its service providers for the purposes of the provision of information and communications technology support services to the department
- used or disclosed where it is otherwise required or authorised by law.

The department does not intend to disclose your personal information to any overseas recipients.

- how individuals can access and seek correction of the personal information held by the department;
- how complaints about potential breaches or breaches of the Privacy Act can be made;
- how the department will deal with these complaints.

The department commissioned an independent privacy impact assessment (PIA). The PIA assesses the flows of information under the Collection, compliance with the Privacy Act and measures in place to safeguard the personal information being collected.
