




OFF-Site Parking Responsibilities

We have been inundated with complaints about our families disregarding driving compliance condition and disrespecting road rules. Please ensure that you adhere to the following road rules:

- **Do Not** block or park in neighbouring driveways
- **Do Not** double park. Even if it is for a few seconds.
- Only those persons with **DISABLED stickers** are permitted to park in the disabled parking bays at front of school.
- **Do Not** park on people's nature strips.

On-Site Parking Responsibilities

- **CAR PARK GATES:** The entrance to the school car park is the gate at the front of the school. The back car park gate is an **EXIT ONLY**.
- **REVERSE PARKING AT ALL TIMES:** To ensure a smooth exit during pickup times, please reverse into the parking spaces in our car parks rather than driving in forwards.
- **DRIVEWAYS MUST REMAIN CLEAR AT ALL TIMES:** Please do not park in the driveway while the gates are closed as doing so blocks OshClub employees from entering the school.
- **NO CHILD MAY WALK TO CARS (At the Basketball Courts) ALONE.**
- **A 5 km/h SPEED LIMIT APPLIES IN THE CAR PARK.**
- **PLEASE DO NOT ENTER THE SCHOOL BEFORE 3PM.** (Sometimes visitors or staff may need to enter or leave the school earlier than 3PM but this does not permit anyone else to enter the school earlier than 3PM, other than OSHClub staff).

School Ground Responsibilities

Please use appropriate walkway to drop off or collect your children from classrooms. The **front of the school is not a walk way to the Prep building**. This is an unsafe and unsupervised area.

Access to this area of the school is only permitted while students are dropping off or collecting their bikes for travel to and from the school.

CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two;
 - a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the *State Concessions Act 2004*, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
 - b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
 - c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (29 January 2018) or term two (16 April 2018).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2018 closes on 29 June, 2018.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.

PARISH UPDATE 57

Hello everyone!

Items have come to my desk during last week from various parts of our Church, from local to universal.

Our frustration and annoyance continues about the '2 square metre rule' still placing limitations on the number who are allowed in our churches. Included in a letter from the Archbishop at the end of last week was this:

As you may also be aware, recent media has indicated that the MCG could be welcoming in 100% capacity for the ANZAC day match. I want to assure you that I have personally raised our concerns around parity for places of worship with both State and Federal Governments this week, and our Archdiocese has joined voices of other faith communities in strongly expressing our marginalisation s restrictions continued to be eased. There are also concerns being raised around electronic record keeping and QR systems. A great deal of work is being done in this space to ensure that we have the correct information, and you will be given guidelines very soon.

In our Parish we're continuing to 'hold the line' according to current instructions. When will we be allowed to change?!?!?

Archbishop Comensoli also wrote seriously about the establishment of a new process for reporting and responding to abuse in the Archdiocese. His introduction of the consultation phase towards a new model is an attachment with this letter.

In our Parish we have established the role of 'Child Safeguarding Officer' to help us comply with all government and Church requirements in this area. Contact can be made directly through mobile phone number 0413 841 936 and by email StAlbans.csc@cam.org.au . Reports received through these contacts will be forwarded to authorities within 48 hours as required by law.

One aspect of the role of our Child Safeguarding Officer is to ensure that everyone involved in all ministries in our Parish has a Working With Children Check – the Parish will assist in acquiring these.

A national item came from the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, encouraging us to 'take the jab' – the vaccine for the COVID virus. It's a strong statement, putting our decision about the vaccine in the context of moral life. The Bishops urge us to take the vaccine as it becomes available, and continue:

For those who have 'a serious reason' not to receive the vaccine, they are morally obliged to do their utmost, by other protective means and appropriate behaviour, to avoid contracting COVID-19 themselves and to avoid transmission of the disease.

That's strong talk, isn't it!

And a strong observation and comment came from the Vatican.

"The Church is a great school of prayer," Pope Francis said in his weekly general audience last week.

"And this is an essential task of the Church: to pray and teach how to pray, to transmit from generation to generation the lamp of faith with the oil of prayer," he said.

Pope Francis encouraged Christians to examine their lives to ensure that personal prayer is a priority. "Everything in the Church originates in prayer, and everything grows thanks to prayer," the Pope said. Speaking into the camera from the Vatican's Apostolic Palace, the Pope posed a question to everyone watching his weekly broadcast: "Do you pray?" he asked.

"How do you pray? Like a parrot? Or do I pray with my heart? How do I pray? Do I pray as part of the Church and pray with the Church? Or do I pray a little according to my ideas and make my ideas become prayer? This is pagan, not Christian prayer," he said.

As we are hearing in the Sunday Readings from the Acts of the Apostles, from the beginning the Church community has held prayer, the teaching of the Apostles, and good works as basic essentials.

And locally: young Parishioners at Sacred Heart School gathered during the week with their families for their first experience of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This was another 'carry over' from the postponements due to the COVID restrictions of last year. Frs Tom Cleary, Ray Scanlon and Peter Hudson assisted us. May these young Parishioners and their families always keep in mind God's love for them.

It feels like we're really heading towards the winter months. The Acts of the Apostles talks about the 'warmth' of the faith of the early Church in Christ Risen, and the 'fire' of enthusiasm to live the life of the Risen Christ. Another attachment with this letter reflects on the impact of Easter faith.

**Public Consultation opens on Catholic Church's New Model for
Complaints and Redress in Victoria**

The Catholic Dioceses of Victoria have today announced the opening of a public consultation period for a new process of response to complaints and redress relating to abuse in the Catholic Church. It is important that voices of those who have experienced abuse are heard, and that their feedback helps to shape this new model.

The proposed model, **Pathways Victoria**, will provide an operationally independent structure for implementing the Catholic Church's National Response Protocol released earlier this year, and will provide a person-centred and trauma-informed response. This responds directly to Recommendations 7.7 and 16.37 of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse. Pathways Victoria will replace the Melbourne Response and Towards Healing processes that have been in place for nearly twenty-five years and will operate alongside the vital and ongoing services of Carelink.

This new model will offer a set of compassionate, just and appropriately resourced processes to investigate complaints and respond to survivors, as an alternative to existing options such as the National Redress Scheme and civil litigation. It offers a pathway where survivors are listened to, acknowledged, compensated and given care. For those who seek it, survivors have an opportunity to reconnect spiritually, with the restoration of links with the Church community.

Early notification of this announcement was shared with individual survivors and advocacy groups to enable support to be sought where needed, as well as with key stakeholders including the Acting Premier and the Commission for Children and Young People.

Survivors, their support persons and others who have lived with the effects of abuse, or have professional experience in this area, are strongly encouraged to be represented in this consultation phase, which will run from 13 April until 14 May 2021.

For people of faith Lent is a time of great anticipation as we await the arrival of Easter. I am sure that the people in the countries where Columban Missionaries live and work are preparing to rejoice in their parishes and communities. Why? Because of the good news of Jesus' Resurrection is not only good news for Jesus. It is especially good news for us too!

Easter reminds us that we too will rise from the dead. In the Resurrection, we also believe that Jesus has not left us behind but is always with us. The question might be: what is Jesus doing when He is with us? Is He just providing us with companionship? Two words remind me that Jesus is more than a companion with us on the road. They are healing and transformation.

Healing

In the risen Jesus, through the power of the Resurrection, through the Holy Spirit, He is at work in the hearts and minds of millions of people to bring healing to individuals and nations.

Transformation

It is common to speak of our growth in life as a journey through a series of transformations. We may sometimes feel that we have reached a physical plateau, but the spirit within us keeps pushing forward. We start to feel things changing within us and then there is a breakthrough. We may even see ourselves and other people differently.

We often read stories where people have had a crisis and with the help of others, they come to a new understanding and a new perspective on life. They have been transformed. This is the power of the Resurrection at work.

Easter is not just a remembrance of something that happened a long time ago and is far from our everyday lives. It is a celebration of what God continues to do in us and in our communities. Despite being crucified, He rose

from the dead because of the love God has for us. That same love continues to heal and transform our whole world. We can bump into the risen Jesus at any time. Sometimes it's dramatic while other times it's more subtle. We might even miss seeing Him.

Collection Notice for parents/guardians

2021 Student Residential Address and Other Information

The Australian Government Department of Education, Skills and Employment (the department) would like to advise you that a request has been made for your child's school to provide residential address and other information as required under the *Australian Education Regulation 2013* (Cth).

The school is required to provide the department with the following information about each student at the school:

- Names and residential addresses of students' parent(s) and/or guardian(s)
- Student residential address (excluding student names)
- Whether the student is a primary or secondary student (education level)
- Whether the student is boarding or a day student (boarding status).

Your child's school generates a **unique and unidentifiable** record number for each student record. The number is **only** used by the school for this collection. **It is not allowed to be used for any other purpose.** The number indicates to the department that each record provided is for one student.

Purpose of the collection

The Student Residential Address and Other Information Collection (the Collection) informs Australian Government school education policy and helps ensure funding for non-government schools is based on need.

The information collected will be used to inform school funding calculations. It is combined with data held by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) to calculate a non-government school community's anticipated capacity to contribute to the costs of schooling.

From 2020, a new measure of capacity to contribute, the Direct Measure of Income (DMI), was introduced. The DMI is based on the median income of parents or guardians of students at a non-government school using data collected through the Collection. Use and disclosure of personal information

Your personal information is protected by law under the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth) (Privacy Act). Personal information is information or an opinion about an identifiable individual. Personal information includes an individual's name and contact details.

Any use or disclosure of your personal information must occur in accordance with Privacy Act and the *Australian Education Act 2013* and *Australian Education Regulation 2013*.

Your personal information provided to the department through the Collection may be:

- disclosed to the ABS for the purposes of capacity to contribute calculations and analysis as a part of the Multi-Agency Data Integration Project (MADIP). Further information about MADIP can be found on the [MADIP page](#) on the ABS website.
- disclosed to a contracted auditor where the department may from time to time, carry out an audit of a school's submission to the Collection. The contracted auditor compares the school's submission with the student enrolment information held by the school and will not use the information for any other purpose
- disclosed to its service providers for the purposes of the provision of information and communications technology support services to the department
- used or disclosed where it is otherwise required or authorised by law.

The department does not intend to disclose your personal information to any overseas recipients.

The department's privacy policy can be found at www.dese.gov.au and includes information on:

- how individuals can access and seek correction of the personal information held by the department;
- how complaints about potential breaches or breaches of the Privacy Act can be made;
- how the department will deal with these complaints.

The department commissioned an independent privacy impact assessment (PIA). The PIA assesses the flows of information under the Collection, compliance with the Privacy Act and measures in place to safeguard the personal information being collected. You are not required to do anything. Your school is responsible for providing the requested details to the department; however, you may wish to ensure that your school has the most up-to-date and correct details for your family.
