Notice on Head Lice

Medical Alert

We have had a reported case of gastro. Please be alert and monitor you child for any symptoms, including: abdominal cramps, diarrhoea and vomiting.

Parents, if your child is unwell, we ask that you keep them away from school until they no longer present with syptoms. If they present with any symptoms of gastro or any other illness in the mornings, please keep them at home. If they show any signs of being unwell at school, we will immediately contact you to pick them up.

Notice on Early Pickups and Appointments

Sometimes students need to be collected from school early, such as when they might have an appointment. However, pickups that take place during recess or lunchtime can be difficult to facilitate, as this usually involves needing to locate the child(ren) outside or have them wait in the office from the beginning of their break times.

For this reason, we kindly request that any early pickups from school (whether students are returning later in the day or not) take place outside of break times, if at all possible. As a reminder, we also kindly ask that you inform the classroom teacher(s) and the front office the day or the morning before, if you know you will be collecting your child(ren) early, so that they can pack their things and be ready quickly once you arrive.

Library Borrowing is Back! (For one day per week)

Children across the school have begun to borrow directly from the library. Students in grades prep, 1, 2, 5 and 6 will be able to borrow on Tuesdays, and students in grades 3 and 4 will be able to borrow on Fridays.

Children are to return their library books the day before they borrow or earlier, as this ensures their books are returned, back on the shelf for others to borrow. The 'book returns' trolley is located in the foyer outside the library. They will be encouraged to borrow 2 books each week IF they have a library bag and have returned any books they have previously borrow





Playing our part to build a national picture of child health

In early 2021, our school, along with thousands of others across the country will begin preparations for the fifth Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC gives us a national picture of the development, health and wellbeing of children in their first year of full-time school. Since 2009, the census results have helped communities, schools and governments plan services and develop better policies to target support for children and families.

Children don't miss any class time, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information for the census. The AEDC gives us data at a school and community level - it isn't an assessment of individual children.

Some teachers have also noticed that completing the assessments made them more aware of the needs of individual children and the class as a whole and that the census results are useful in planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing class programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.

Nude Food Day Every Monday at Cana

Dear Parents, Guardians and Students,

We have been seeing a problem around the school grounds, so this is an initiative to fix this. Our intention is to educate students to think about the amount of packaging they bring to school each day, and the impact this has on our environment.

The food packaging is part of a bigger problem. For example, each food package starts from home, comes to school, ends up on our grounds, then washes into our drains and waterways. All this leads to it ending up on our beaches and oceans, causing the death of aquatic life. We need to change.

Each Monday will now be a Nude Food Day. This is a day where we highly encourage students to have a lunchbox free of food wrappers, such as chip packaging, glad wrap or aluminium foil. You must carry your food in reusable containers and packaging that can't be thrown away.

If in the event that a student brings any food wrappers, it is compulsory that they leave the used wrappers inside their lunchbox, to be thrown away when the student comes home.

Even so, we still would definitely want all students to have rubbish free lunch boxes to help the environment here at Cana.

OFF-Site Parking Responsibilities

We have been inundated with complaints about our families disregarding driving compliance condition and disrespecting road rules. Please ensure that you adhere to the following road rules:

- **Do Not** block or park in neighbouring driveways
- <u>Do Not</u> double park. Even if it is for a few seconds.
- Only those persons with <u>DISABLED stickers</u> are permitted to park in the disabled parking bays at front of school.
- <u>Do Not</u> park on people's nature strips.

On-Site Parking Responsibilities

- **CAR PARK GATES:** The entrance to the school car park is the gate at the front of the school. The back car park gate is an **EXIT ONLY**.
- **REVERSE PARKING AT ALL TIMES:** To ensure a smooth exit during pickup times, please reverse into the parking spaces in our car parks rather than driving in forwards.
- **DRIVEWAYS MUST REMAIN CLEAR AT ALL TIMES:** Please do not park in the driveway while the gates are closed as doing so blocks OshClub employees from entering the school.
- NO CHILD MAY WALK TO CARS (At the Basketball Courts) ALONE.
- A 5 km/h SPEED LIMIT APPLIES IN THE CAR PARK.
- PLEASE DO NOT ENTER THE SCHOOL BEFORE 3PM. (Sometimes visitors or staff may need to enter of leave the school earlier than 3PM but this does not permit anyone else to enter the school earlier than 3PM, other than OSHClub staff).

School Ground Responsibilites

Please use the appropriate walkways to drop off or collect your children from classrooms. The <u>front of the school is not a walkway to the Prep building</u>. This is an unsafe and unsupervised area.

Access to this area of the school is only permitted while students are dropping off or collecting their bikes for travel to and from the school.

PARISH UPDATE 60

Hello everyone!

Continuing Easter greetings to everyone – for the last time this year!

This coming weekend has the feast of the Ascension, followed the weekend after with Pentecost. As one of the prayers of Sunday's Mass puts it: 'Christ has now moved beyond our sight, not to abandon us but to be our hope'. Ascension opens that transition to the presence of the Holy Spirit throughout our lives.

One of the activities during the month of May in the Catholic Church throughout Australia has been the annual MassCount – conducted in churches at all Saturday night/Sunday Masses of the number of people who are present at Mass across four weekends. Over the years this data has given an estimate of what is happening with Church attendance, and has given broad assistance to those who plan for application of the resources of the Church. This planning looks at current participation and also at 'trends' by comparing figures year by year.

This is another activity that the pandemic has affected. In our Parish we are restricted to allowing 190 people into our churches for each Mass. Last year we were in lockdown and were allowed five people for each Mass. For the last 'proper' MassCount we had an average of 2352 people at Masses on the weekends of May 2019. So useful comparisons can't be made with data from 2020 and 2021.

Two new elements in the MassCount that have been introduced for this year are that this weekend we are asked to estimate the male/female mix. And then the following week we will be asking those present to indicate their ages (within 10-year cohorts)! In 'normal' circumstances these figures would have some point after several years – to see if any 'trends' are showing. (One Parishioner 'of a certain age' told me that she won't be booking in for Mass on the weekend when we collect data on age: "that's my business," she said!)

Our Baptism Preparation Team is meeting this week to re-start a regular roster and a regular inclusion of part of the Baptism ceremony in Saturday night/Sunday Masses. We will invite the parents and the godparents to a weekend Mass and introduce them to the community, then sign the child-to-be-baptised with the Cross and the Oil of Catechumens. On the first and third Sundays of each month we will proceed with all the other elements of Baptism (centring on the pouring of Water) at 12noon at either Sacred Heart or Emmaus church, when parents can invite family and friends to join in and celebrate. This is a great Ministry – opening the way for families further into the life of Christ and the life of the Church!

You will remember that in Letter 58 I shared with you information about the Archbishop's plan to group Parishes together into what he is calling 'Missions'. Fr Gerard Keith, Parish Priest next door at Resurrection, Kings Park, has invited the Parish Priests of the Parishes in our area to discuss this "so that we're active in the play and not overrun by it". Great initiative, Gerard!

Another reorganisation that is nearing completion is the Archbishop's creation of a company (Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – MACS) to oversee, monitor and manage Catholic Education in the Archdiocese. This was mandated by the State Government following recommendations from the Royal Commission into abuse. Important elements in this re-structuring are that Parish Priests are no longer the employers of staff in Catholic Schools; and the establishment of School Advisory Councils for each School and College. These Councils are to be in place by the end of this year, operating within prescribed Terms of Reference. This sort of governance has been in place in many parts of Australia for quite some years. The transition is asking a lot of extra energy and attention from our Principals as they re-orientate into the new system.

Best wishes to all! As we come to the end of the Easter season for this year, remember the thread that has gone through the stories we have heard from the Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles: 'He is risen ... and they are changed!'

Blessings as we continue to live out that renewal!







Collection Notice for parents/guardians 2021 Student Residential Address and Other Information

The Australian Government Department of Education, Skills and Employment (the department) would like to advise you that a request has been made for your child's school to provide residential address and other information as required under the Australian Education Regulation 2013 (Cth).

The school is required to provide the department with the following information about each student at the school:

- Names and residential addresses of students' parent(s) and/or guardian(s)
- Student residential address (excluding student names)
- Whether the student is a primary or secondary student (education level)
- Whether the student is boarding or a day student (boarding status).

Your child's school generates a unique and unidentifiable record number for each student record. The number is only used by the school for this collection. It is not allowed to be used for any other purpose. The number indicates to the department that each record provided is for one student.

Purpose of the collection

The Student Residential Address and Other Information Collection (the Collection) informs Australian Government school education policy and helps ensure funding for non-government schools is based on need.

The information collected will be used to inform school funding calculations. It is combined with data held by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) to calculate a non-government school community's anticipated capacity to contribute to the costs of schooling.

From 2020, a new measure of capacity to contribute, the Direct Measure of Income (DMI), was introduced. The DMI is based on the median income of parents or guardians of students at a non-government school using data collected through the Collection. More information about the DMI can be found at https://www.education.gov.au/what-direct-measure-income.

Use and disclosure of personal information

Your personal information is protected by law under the Privacy Act 1988 (Cth) (Privacy Act). Personal information is information or an opinion about an identifiable individual. Personal information includes an individual's name and contact details.

Any use or disclosure of your personal information must occur in accordance with Privacy Act and the Australian Education Act 2013 and Australian Education Regulation 2013.

Your personal information provided to the department through the Collection may be:

- disclosed to the ABS for the purposes of capacity to contribute calculations and analysis as a part of the Multi-Agency Data Integration Project (MADIP). Further information about MADIP can be found on the MADIP page on the ABS website.
- disclosed to a contracted auditor where the department may from time to time, carry out an audit of
 a school's submission to the Collection. The contracted auditor compares the school's submission with
 the student enrolment information held by the school and will not use the information for any other
 purpose
- disclosed to its service providers for the purposes of the provision of information and communications technology support services to the department
- used or disclosed where it is otherwise required or authorised by law.

The department does not intend to disclose your personal information to any overseas recipients.

The department's privacy policy can be found at www.dese.gov.au and includes information on:

- how individuals can access and seek correction of the personal information held by the department;
- how complaints about potential breaches or breaches of the Privacy Act can be made;
- how the department will deal with these complaints.

The department commissioned an independent privacy impact assessment (PIA). The PIA assesses the flows of information under the Collection, compliance with the Privacy Act and measures in place to safeguard the personal information being collected. The report is being updated, and will be available in 2021 on the SchoolsHUB Address Collection help and support page. The current version is available at https://docs.education.gov.au/node/51436.

What do you need to do?

You are not required to do anything. Your school is responsible for providing the requested details to the department; however, you may wish to ensure that your school has the most up-to-date and correct details for your family.
