COVID INFORMATION

COVID Update

Friday 4th December

- There have been **NO NEW TRANSMISSIONS** this week.
- All children who were in isolation have returned to school over the course of the week.
- We welcome them back to their classrooms.
- ‘Rapid Antigen Test’ kits were distributed to relevant students impacted by COVID.
- **COVID REPORTS from Kindergartens.** We took precautionary measures with providing two R.A. Tests to students attending the Pre Prep Program. This was a priority measure to ensure new enrolments for 2022 could attend the Prep prep Pogram safely.
- We are still waiting for the Government to provide ‘air purifiers’ – Open natural ventilation (open doors and windows) in classrooms and enclosed spaces are a priority.
- Classroom teachers are planning outside learning experiences wherever possible.
- Orientation – Tuesday 7th December will be conducted outside to ensure a further measure of safety for our students who will be meeting their new classroom teacher 2022 and getting to know their new classmates.
- Thank you to families for your open communication and your understanding
- I will keep you informed as we head into the home-run for this school year.

I am proud to acknowledge all our dedicated staff members who are working tirelessly to provide a safe, caring environment for all our students on site.

With God’s Grace we will finish this year strong with a spirit of Hope.

The Victorian Government has announced important changes to the management of COVID-19 cases and close contacts in schools as we reach the 90% double dose milestone for eligible people in the coming days.

This means that children who are exposed persons (previously identified as close contacts in education settings) from an exposure at school no longer have to quarantine for between 7 and 14 days. They can instead return immediately to school after providing evidence of a negative result from a standard PCR test to our service.

In exceptional circumstances the Department of Health may determine that close contacts in significant school outbreaks are still required to quarantine for seven days. In this scenario, children will be notified directly of any additional quarantine arrangements.

You are now able to send your child to school if you follow these steps:

- your child isn't a household contact and is instead in quarantine due to a COVID-19 exposure at school
- your child must get a standard PCR test at your local COVID-19 testing site. If the PCR test is negative, please provide the results to school by emailing your classroom teacher as soon as possible.
- your child can then return to school
- It is strongly recommended your child take a Rapid Antigen Test (R.A.T) at home on the morning of each day they attend school. We are still waiting to receive our allocation of R.A.T kits. However, if you wish to obtain a R.A.T kit, they are available for you to source at pharmacies, supermarkets and testing centres.

Rapid Antigen Tests are strongly recommended for those children who have returned a negative PCR result and return to school.

They are a great tool for families to use to keep your child and the school safe and ensure that positive cases are identified at the earliest possible time. You will get a pack of five tests and you should use them each day before your child attends the school or until you run out.

Families should also use a Rapid Antigen Test whenever their child is visiting a high-risk location or setting during this period. This includes visiting elderly or immunocompromised relatives or friends.

Thank you for supporting this important approach, which will help keep our school safe and reduce the disruption to the entire school community.

Covid Testing Information

Please note that if any child attending Cana is waiting for COVID test results, **that child CANNOT return to Cana for onsite learning until the “negative result” is emailed to the classroom teacher or office.**

Thank you for your understanding and for abiding by the current COVID safety guidelines.

DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL WHEN SICK

Another reminder to families that children **ARE NOT** to be brought to school if they are unwell or showing **ANY COVID** like symptoms. If they are brought to school, we will need to send them home. **DO NOT** tell your children to ‘see how they go’, if they are unwell.

Students who are Sent Home

We recommend that any student who was collected from school due to presenting unwell receives a COVID test before they return to school, and ensure that their symptoms have cleared. It is important that you **DO NOT** send your children back to school until their symptoms clear. If they return and are still presenting with symptoms, **they will be sent home again.**

Face Masks

As directed by the Victorian Government:

- **Facemasks are only mandatory when inside**
- A new mandate issued by the Victorian Government has been put in place whereby ***ALL*** students from ***Grade 3 upwards***, will be required to wear face masks when indoors.
- We ask that you ensure that your child/ren have been supplied with masks each day to use while engaged in classroom learning activities.
- We understand there may be some exceptions. However, the intention of this directive is to maximise safety while children are at school.
- ***Please communicate any exemptions or individual circumstances to your child's teacher via email prior to their return to onsite learning.***
- Children in Grades Prep, 1 and 2 are highly encouraged to wear masks indoors.
- For education purposes, teachers and education support staff are not required to wear face masks while teaching, but it is recommended that face masks be worn while teaching wherever practicable.

A face mask must cover the nose and mouth. Face shields, scarves or bandanas do not meet these requirements.

NEW ADDED SAFETY MEASURE AND EXPECTATION

Given the critical circumstances of the COVID VIRUS currently impacting on many students and families at Cana...we are adding the following expectation:

ALL ADULTS ARE TO WEAR A MASK WHILE ON SCHOOL SITE
Everyone needs to do their bit in order to minimise possible transmission.

Ventilation

Ventilation is a high priority in order to ensure clean air quality is provided for our students. We will increase fresh air flow into indoor classroom spaces, including shared spaces throughout the school. Cana has been advised by the Victorian Government that we will receive air purifiers for our school. Unfortunately, we do not have a date when this will occur, but we will implement the following:
Natural Ventilation: we will keep windows, doors and vents open as much as possible, ensuring fresh air flow occurs in all classrooms and shared spaces. We are hopeful the air purifiers will be sent ASAP.

We must always remember to be Respectful Partners

We are partners in Education. This means our children, the staff and parents can expect that they will all be treated with respect and care at all times. Please remember courtesy in the way we speak and behave towards each other is important.

Go gently, we are all working together and share in the goal of providing a welcoming, engagning, supportive and respectful environment at Cana.

Summer Uniform – NO HAT NO PLAY

Students **must** wear their hats when playing outside. **No hat no play!** We ask children to be responsible for their own hats. If they forget their hat, it will not be sent to them from the office if a parent drops it off.

We understand that Melbourne weather can be unpredicatable. If it is a cold day, children are welcome to wear either their **full** summer or **full** winter uniforms.

Chocolate Money

Disappointingly there is a large amount of money that was not returned. The chocolates presumably have been consumed by those families. There have been several notifications and phone calls and still money has not been sent to the school. A phone call will be made by the Principal in the coming week.

Thank you to those who have returned their fundraising money. We still have a number of families who have not yet returned their chocolate fundraising money. If you have not handed yours in yet, please do so urgently once your child is back to onsite learning next week.

Key Enrolment Dates for Year 5 Students in 2022

The key enrolment dates for students in Year 5 in 2022 who will be starting Year 7 in 2024 have been decided and are as follows:

- 28th January 2022 – Applications will open for Year 5 students commencing Year 7 in 2024
- 19th August 2022 – Applications will close
- 21st October 2022 – Offers will be posted to prospective Year 7 applicants
- 11th November – Final date for parents/carers to accept an offer made by the school

Tree Branches

Parents to be mindful of broken tree branches around the school area. Council has yet to clear and assess the area.

Branches can potentially break at any given time. Communicate to your child/ren not to wait or play under trees. A neighbour shared her concern about children's safety.

Problems with SkoolBag

We have been advised that some families are experiencing difficulties when trying to access SkoolBag. If this is the case, SkoolBag has advised that you should try deleting, reinstalling and then logging in to the app. This should hopefully resolve your issues.

Open the Apple App store or the Google Play store on your device and search for and install 'SkoolBag'.





RE: NOTICE OF 2022 SCHOOL FEES

I take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support and collaborative partnership throughout the current school year. During the Covid-19 pandemic, students and staff have displayed resilience and growth as they travel the educational journey together. Each individual has risen to the evolving challenges presented to them during the environment of remote learning. All staff enthusiastically await the return of our students for onsite face to face learning, to support their educational development whilst fostering enhancement to friendship groups and individual needs.

In conjunction with Fr Maurie Cooney, our Parish Priest, Cana Leadership elected not to increase school fees for the 2021 school year despite significant increases to operational costs incurred by the school. This was a conscious decision aimed to provide our families some relief to the impact of Covid-19 lockdown restrictions.

Review of all operational requirements, including expenses, are conducted annually. The review also consists of monitoring school fees of our neighbouring and for like catholic schools. The table below provides comparative fee structure for 2021 of catholic schools within proximity of Cana.

Our aim at Cana is to provide high quality education across all year levels for all students. Due to increasing operational costs for all services, utilities and equipment, Cana school fees will increase for the 2022 school year. Cana Leadership have endeavoured to retain school fees as low as possible for the benefit of all Cana families.

Cana has historically fully subsidised a variety of student activities each year since opening. From 2022, students in years 3,4 and 6 will be charged a small fee as a Sacramental Levy. Students in Years 5 and 6 will be charged a Sport Levy as a co-contribution of the interschool sports program. These new levies represent a small contribution to the overall cost associated with these activities and are outlined in the attached Notice of 2022 School Fees.

COVID-SAFE RESTRICTIONS HAVE BEEN EASED.

Although we’re not all directly connected with schools, their rhythms shape all of our lives, I notice.

And really into the Season of Advent now with its Second Sunday this weekend. John the Baptist is the central Gospel character for this and the following weekend. He is such an interesting character. Many people seemed perplexed by the way he lived his life. He wasn’t someone you would approach or go to if you wanted to be given an easy answer or to be flattered. He told the truth and pointed past himself and directed others to someone greater: Jesus. And people did gather around him.

During this season of Advent, it’s a key time to look beyond ourselves and straight to Jesus. Our faith can sometimes just be something we lean into because it feels comfortable or familiar. However, as Pope Benedict XVI said, “We were not made for comfort!” John wasn’t concerned by what the world held to be important. He was passionate about God, and the promise of God to be amongst the people. That fits with Advent’s call for us to re-focus our life of faith.

The shopping centres are getting busier, too. Google tells me that ‘Black Friday’ last week signalled the beginning of the Christmas retail period. An attachment with this Letter reflects on gift-giving (*We are the Heart on Earth of a Generous, Giving God*). It suggests that we might consider gift-giving beyond our usual circle. You could donate to the St Vincent de Paul Society, for example, by using the [online donation facility](#) provided on their website (vinnies.org.au) or by calling 13 18 12. (Donations of \$2 and more to the Society are tax deductible). At the foot of the ‘pre-Christmas’ trees on the sanctuary of our churches there is a ‘giving box’ - they are cleared after each Mass to be forwarded to the Vinnies.

Times for Christmas Masses have been set. See an attachment with this Letter for a copy. Before that, we will be gathering for

on Wednesday 15th December at 7.30pm in Emmaus church

and on Thursday 16th December at 7.30pm in Sacred Heart church

These Prayer Services will be followed by the opportunity for the Sacrament of Penance (First Rite).

This week the Parish Office has sent follow-up material to 70 Parishioners who have completed the ‘ministry recruitment’ process to this stage. A further 20 are being followed up to finalise their acquiring their Working With Children Check. This is a great response to our beginning to re-open Parish life – thank you!

Accordingly, as more people come to our churches on Saturday nights and Sundays those ‘ministry recruitment’ forms will be available in the church foyers; and are attached with this Letter again.

We still won’t draw up rosters yet. That will give more Parishioners time to join in; and it allows December and January to be a little more ‘free’. So I’m thinking that early February 2022 will see our new sets of rosters established.

Advent takes us to the heart of our faith: Jesus Christ has come into our human story at that first Christmas; is part of our lives in many ways now; and opens the way into the future fulfilment of his mission:

The ‘final coming of Christ’ - that is, the reign of God for which we strive with every breath as we shape our lives - will come in all its fullness. This is the coming for which we wait. This is the ‘fullness of life’ for which we long. This is what we mean when we sing “Maranatha”. ‘Come, Lord Jesus, come’ is one rendering of the word. But taken from the Greek, as “mara atha” - two words – “The Lord has come” is another equally acceptable translation. Then the comings — past, present, and future — all live together in one long sigh of the soul. (Joan Chittester, Ancient Practices 65-66)

Another attachment has information on opportunities for accessing Mass on TV or online. However read the announcement at the start of this letter – our churches are open again!!

families. Women and youth plant gardens of greens for the family and market; plant fruit trees for food and shade. All this is PURE GIFT.


As a nation we are gifted with the arrival of migrants from other countries who enrich us

A significant impact of COVID lockdowns for the Sacred Heart/Emmaus Parish has been that we have had to limit severely all our Ministry activity.

When restrictions begin to ease we will be in a position to reassemble our various ministry groups. That will be the opportunity to re-engage with our community in those well-established ‘tried and true’ ways, to re-form our groups and invite new participation, and to offer ‘formation for ministry’ as a refresher or an introduction.




