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

SCHOOL PARKING REMINDERS

WEEK 8 COVID SCHOOL UPDATE

- Total of 10 positive COVID cases reported within our school community in the last week.
- Two of these cases were not infectious while onsite.
- Students continue to test at home on Mondays and Wednesdays using the Rapid Antigen Tests provided.
- Learning grids provided to those isolating due to having COVID. or being a 'Close Contact'.
- Masks mandatory for Grade 3-6's.
- Extra RAT test provided to grade 6 students who are isolating due to being a Personal Close Contact while at camp.
- Parents onsite wearing face masks.
- Daily communication at grade and school level, when positive cases are reported.
- 7 people returning on Monday while most will return by mid week next week.

We hold all those in our school community affected by COVID in our thoughts and prayers, for a speedy recovery and return to school.

GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS AND CARERS ON SCHOOL SITE

MACS COVID-19 Vaccinations – Parents and Carers on School Sites Guidelines



Purpose of these guidelines and commencement

The purpose of these guidelines is to outline the required process for Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) education facilities to manage MACS' vaccination requirements relating to parents, carers and other visitors not performing work on school sites.

These guidelines commence with immediate effect and operate until further notice.

Vaccination requirements for parents, carers and other visitors not performing work

All parents, carers and other visitors attending schools, including for drop-off and pick-up, must adhere to physical distancing, density limits and face mask requirements, and practise respiratory etiquette and good hand hygiene.

Schools must sight vaccination information of parents, carers and other adult visitors not performing work who enter school buildings (excluding students who visit a school to complete a secondary school subject, such as a VET subject). Schools do not need to collect, record or hold the information in these circumstances.

Parents, carers and other adult visitors (excluding students who visit a school to complete a secondary school subject) who enter school buildings must have had two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine or have a valid medical exception, with the following limited exceptions:

- when attending to administer medical treatment to their own child where the treatment cannot be administered by the school
- when attending to collect their child who is unwell and cannot leave the school building unaccompanied by their parent/carer
- when attending for a momentary period that does not involve any sustained contact with staff or students, for example, to collect a completed art project or similar.

Parents, carers and other adult visitors attending school sites for drop-off and pick-up who do not enter school buildings do not need to comply with vaccination requirements.

Parents, carers and other adult visitors attending a gathering at school, such as a fete, school play or other school ceremony, whether indoors or outdoors, need to show evidence of vaccination on arrival.

When parents and carers do not meet vaccination requirements, the school should hold meetings and other discussions (such as Student Support Group meetings) virtually.

Schools should advise external providers who use or hire school facilities outside school hours that they are responsible for ensuring the use aligns with the <u>Open Premises Order</u> including vaccination requirements.

Medically excepted persons

In line with the Mandatory Vaccination Orders, parents, carers and visitors may be able to show that they are an 'excepted person'.

Parents and carers who are considered excepted persons may enter school buildings.

This is a very limited category and applies only if the person has obtained an Australian Immunisation Register immunisation medical exemption certificate from their medical practitioner stating that they are unable, due to a medical contraindication or an acute medical illness (including COVID-19), to receive a dose, or a further dose, of a COVID-19 vaccine.

Exceptional circumstances


An unvaccinated parent, carer or visitor may be able to attend a school site to either:

- respond to an emergency at the facility
- provide urgent care due to an emergency situation or a critical unforeseen circumstance.

These exceptions only apply for the time required to respond to the exceptional circumstance, and the school should ensure that the unvaccinated parent, carer or visitor leaves the facility as soon as possible.

Schools should exhaust all other options before calling on an unvaccinated person to respond to an emergency situation.

ie: pay \$2,400.00 instead of \$2,450.00 to allow for the \$50 rebate to be applied to your 2022 school fee account.



Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary Basilica of Saint Peter 25 March 2022

O Mary, Mother of God and our Mother, in this time of trial we turn to you. As our Mother, you love us and know us: no concern of our hearts is hidden from you. Mother of mercy, how often we have experienced your watchful care and your peaceful presence! You never cease to guide us to Jesus, the Prince of Peace.

Yet we have strayed from that path of peace. We have forgotten the lesson learned from the tragedies of the last century, the sacrifice of the millions who fell in two world wars. We have disregarded the commitments we made as a community of nations. We have betrayed peoples' dreams of peace and the hopes of the young. We grew sick with greed, we thought only of our own nations and their interests, we grew indifferent and caught up in our selfish needs and concerns. We chose to ignore God, to be satisfied with our illusions, to grow arrogant and aggressive, to suppress innocent lives and to stockpile weapons. We stopped being our neighbour's keepers and stewards of our common home. We have ravaged the garden of the earth with war and by our sins we have broken the heart of our heavenly Father, who desires us to be brothers and sisters. We grew indifferent to everyone and everything except ourselves. Now with shame we cry out: Forgive us, Lord!

Holy Mother, amid the misery of our sinfulness, amid our struggles and weaknesses, amid the mystery of iniquity that is evil and war, you remind us that God never abandons us, but continues to look upon us with love, ever ready to forgive us and raise us up to new life. He has given you to us and made your Immaculate Heart a refuge for the Church and for all humanity. By God's gracious will, you are ever with us; even in the most troubled moments of our history, you are there to guide us with tender love.

We now turn to you and knock at the door of your heart. We are your beloved children. In every age you make yourself known to us, calling us to conversion. At this dark hour, help us and grant us your comfort. Say to us once more: "Am I not here, I who am your Mother?" You are able to untie the knots of our hearts and of our times. In you we place our trust. We are confident that, especially in moments of trial, you will not be deaf to our supplication and will come to our aid.

That is what you did at Cana in Galilee, when you interceded with Jesus and he worked the first of his signs. To preserve the joy of the wedding feast, you said to him: "They have no wine" (*Jn* 2:3). Now, O Mother, repeat those words and that prayer, for in our own day we have run out of the wine of hope, joy has fled, fraternity has faded. We have forgotten our humanity and squandered the gift of peace. We opened our hearts to violence and destructiveness. How greatly we need your maternal help!

Therefore, O Mother, hear our prayer.

Star of the Sea, do not let us be shipwrecked in the tempest of war.

Ark of the New Covenant, inspire projects and paths of reconciliation.

Queen of Heaven, restore God's peace to the world.

Eliminate hatred and the thirst for revenge, and teach us forgiveness.

Free us from war, protect our world from the menace of nuclear weapons.

Queen of the Rosary, make us realise our need to pray and to love.

Queen of the Human Family, show people the path of fraternity.

Queen of Peace, obtain peace for our world.

O Mother, may your sorrowful plea stir our hardened hearts. May the tears you shed for us make this valley parched by our hatred blossom anew. Amid the thunder of weapons, may your prayer turn our thoughts to peace. May your maternal touch soothe those who suffer and flee from the rain of bombs. May your motherly embrace comfort those forced to leave their homes and their native land. May your Sorrowful Heart move us to compassion and inspire us to open our doors and to care for our brothers and sisters who are injured and cast aside.

Hello again everyone!

With preparations well under way for our Holy Week-Easter liturgies, I take this opportunity to draw that timetable to your attention – see further attachment with this letter for details. I encourage all our people to re-connect in our churches for that central week in our Christian faith.

It starts with Palm Sunday on the weekend of 9-10 April, and continues to Easter Sunday on 17 April. If you have small palms and olive branches for our communities for Palm Sunday, you can bring them to the grounds outside Sacred Heart church on Friday 8 April – they will then be prepared for our Masses that weekend.

Many ministries are needed for those ceremonies, as you know. Sign-up pages for those are now in the foyers of our churches. There are many opportunities that are 'non-speaking' roles if that is a concern – for example Washing of the Feet on Holy Thursday, water carrier in the Easter Vigil, and more. And, of course, there are those ministries of Reader (more required than usual) and Communion Minister. When you have signed on, you will be contacted to confirm that; and you will be sent a copy of Reading if that applies.

Before we get to Holy Week, we have our 'Lent Services for Prayer and Reconciliation': Wednesday 6th April: Emmaus at 7.30pm, and Thursday 7th April: Sacred Heart at 7.30pm. Visiting Priests will assist with individual Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Last Sunday's Gospel Reading asked us to 'have a good hard look at ourselves' – for by their fruit they will be known. This reflection may be helpful:

One of the core messages of Lent comes to us today – the call to conversion.

This is about changing one's mind, changing one's tune, having second thoughts, having a rethink, thinking again, thinking differently, thinking twice: about the ways in which we are living the gospel of Jesus – and particularly about the ways we are **not** living the gospel of Jesus.

Conversion is not a 'once off' action (as we may have thought when we referred to someone's changing their religion). The fact is that none of us lives the gospel of Jesus perfectly though that is what we are called to: recall Jesus' words "Love one another as I have loved you"!! And we have to keep working at that throughout our lives.

This is one of the great values of Lent: it clearly and formally calls us to conversion - to have a good, hard look at ourselves to see how we're measuring up as people whose centre of faith is Jesus. If we find that there's the possibility, the need, to cut some things out of our lives (attitudes, words, actions) and take to other, more gospelinspired attitudes, words, actions – then do that.

It's not all up to us. As Moses finds in this weekend's First Reading, **God** is calling and empowering us to conversion. As St Teresa of Avila said: 'Act as if everything depends on you, and pray as if everything depends on God'.

This call to conversion would have us turn away from sin and be renewed in the life that we are committed to, the life of Christ. Living in Christ will bring the fruits of the Kingdom to bear in our world. God believes in our capacity for this, and so draws us further into this 'new life' which we will celebrate at Easter.

The origin of the word 'Lent' has an old-English meaning of 'preparing for spring', it seems, and so fits within the seasons of the northern hemisphere: with the Christian meaning of waiting also for

the New Life of Easter. For us the Season can also have a rich meaning – as the trees drop off their old, no-longer-needed leaves, so we drop from our lives those actions, attitudes, words that are not appropriate for people whose

guiding Light is Jesus. I found Pope Francis' words on Fasting in Lent very direct and down-to-earth and challenging – see another attachment for a copy.

This coming Sunday's Gospel Reading gives us the story of the Forgiving Father and his Two Sons (Lk 15:1-3, 11-32). And the following Fifth Sunday of Lent tells the story of the woman to whom Jesus says, "I do not condemn you: go on your way and sin no more". Another reflection may be helpful in our continuing Lent journey:

Our sin ... and God's love

What is God's approach to us when we sin? The answer is in the Gospel story about the Forgiving Father and the two sons, and how he welcomed both sons, different as they were from each other. That is repeated in the Gospel story as Jesus intervenes and gives another chance at life to the woman in the story. This is what forgiveness does it gives us another chance at life: and God does that for us! A further question is 'are we willing to do that for others?'

"We may not be able to forgive ourselves, others may not forgive us, history may not forgive us. But God does – and not conditionally!" [Vincent MacNamara in <u>The Truth in Lovel</u>

The preface to the Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation I expresses it this way:

It is truly right and just that we should always give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God.:

FASTING IN LENT

Fast from hurting words and say kind words.

Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude.

Fast from anger and be filled with patience.

Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.

Fast from worries and trust in God.

Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity.

Fast from pressures and be prayerful.

Fast from bitterness and fill your heart with joy.

Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others.

Fast from grudges and be reconciled.

Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.


Speaking to your Children about their School Day






