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


SCHOOL PARKING REMINDERS

PLEASE BE SAFE AND CONSIDERATE TOWARDS OTHERS

Onsite parking is supervised by a yard duty teacher both in the morning and afternoon. We have had to speak to many families in regards to following the onsite parking rules to ensure the safety for all. A REMINDER to adhere to the following safety measures.

There should be **NO** cars parking **AT ANYTIME** after the last basketball rings - this causes congestion and cars cannot move around or pass through.

Back Gate

GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS AND CARERS ON SCHOOL SITE

MACS COVID-19 Vaccinations – Parents and Carers on School Sites Guidelines



Purpose of these guidelines and commencement

The purpose of these guidelines is to outline the required process for Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) education facilities to manage MACS' vaccination requirements relating to parents, carers and other visitors not performing work on school sites.

These guidelines commence with immediate effect and operate until further notice.

Vaccination requirements for parents, carers and other visitors not performing work

All parents, carers and other visitors attending schools, including for drop-off and pick-up, must adhere to physical distancing, density limits and face mask requirements, and practise respiratory etiquette and good hand hygiene.

Schools must sight vaccination information of parents, carers and other adult visitors not performing work who enter school buildings (excluding students who visit a school to complete a secondary school subject, such as a VET subject). Schools do not need to collect, record or hold the information in these circumstances.

Parents, carers and other adult visitors (excluding students who visit a school to complete a secondary school subject) who enter school buildings must have had two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine or have a valid medical exception, with the following limited exceptions:

- when attending to administer medical treatment to their own child where the treatment cannot be administered by the school
- when attending to collect their child who is unwell and cannot leave the school building unaccompanied by their parent/carer
- when attending for a momentary period that does not involve any sustained contact with staff or students, for example, to collect a completed art project or similar.

Parents, carers and other adult visitors attending school sites for drop-off and pick-up who do not enter school buildings do not need to comply with vaccination requirements.

Parents, carers and other adult visitors attending a gathering at school, such as a fete, school play or other school ceremony, whether indoors or outdoors, need to show evidence of vaccination on arrival.

When parents and carers do not meet vaccination requirements, the school should hold meetings and other discussions (such as Student Support Group meetings) virtually.

Schools should advise external providers who use or hire school facilities outside school hours that they are responsible for ensuring the use aligns with the [Open Premises Order](#) including vaccination requirements.

Medically excepted persons

In line with the Mandatory Vaccination Orders, parents, carers and visitors may be able to show that they are an 'excepted person'.

Parents and carers who are considered excepted persons may enter school buildings.

This is a very limited category and applies only if the person has obtained an Australian Immunisation Register immunisation medical exemption certificate from their medical practitioner stating that they are unable, due to a medical contraindication or an acute medical illness (including COVID-19), to receive a dose, or a further dose, of a COVID-19 vaccine.

Exceptional circumstances

An unvaccinated parent, carer or visitor may be able to attend a school site to either:

- respond to an emergency at the facility
- provide urgent care due to an emergency situation or a critical unforeseen circumstance.

These exceptions only apply for the time required to respond to the exceptional circumstance, and the school should ensure that the unvaccinated parent, carer or visitor leaves the facility as soon as possible.

Schools should exhaust all other options before calling on an unvaccinated person to respond to an emergency situation.

Hello all - as we come towards the last week of Lent, and then the great feasts of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter!

During next week we will draw Lent to its conclusion in our **Lent Prayer and Reconciliation** gatherings:

Wednesday 6th April at 7.30pm at EMMAUS

Thursday 7th April at 7.30 at SACRED HEART

For those who wish to include individual Reconciliation, there will be three Priests present to assist with the Sacrament.

If you have **palms/olive branches** for our people at our Palm Sunday Masses, will you bring them to Sacred Heart on next Friday 8th April? They will then be prepared for our Masses.

Preparations are under way for our **GOOD FRIDAY STATIONS OF THE CROSS** – to be held on ‘the oval’ at Sacred Heart on Friday 15th April at 11am. This turned out to be a very successful venue last year when COVID regulations had us gathering there, and many comments urged us to gather in that location again for this year.

During the week, the Archbishop called the Priests together for some updates. The Vicar General was a main speaker, re-starting that project of the Archdiocese’s planning for the re-shaping of Parishes in the future. His presentation is summarised in another attachment with this letter.

As the final week of Lent approaches, this weekend’s Gospel offers the foundational appreciation of who this God is, and how this God acts:

Our sin ... and God’s love

What is God’s approach to us when we sin? The answer was in last week’s story about the Forgiving Father and the two sons, and how he welcomed both sons, different as they were from each other, neither having earned

forgiveness by their behaviour. That learning is repeated in this weekend's Gospel as Jesus intervenes and gives another chance at life to the woman in the story.

This is what forgiveness does: it does not approve of the wrongdoing - it gives another, fresh chance at life. And God does that for us.

"We may not be able to forgive ourselves, others may not forgive us, history may not forgive us. But God does – and not conditionally!" [Vincent MacNamara in *The Truth in Love*]

The preface to the Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation 1 expresses it this way:

It is truly right and just that we should always give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God: for you do not cease to spur us on to possess a more abundant life.

Being rich in mercy, you constantly offer pardon and call on sinners to trust in your forgiveness alone.

Never did you turn away from us, and, though time and again we have broken your covenant,

you have bound the human family to yourself through Jesus your Son, our Redeemer, with a new bond of love so tight that it can never be undone.

God is God of mercy and forgiveness, who gives Godself to us in Jesus: THANKS BE TO GOD!!

A further question is 'are we willing to be that for others?'

And we continue to pray for peace:

PRAYER FOR PEACE AND JUSTICE IN UKRAINE

God of peace and justice,
who can change the hardened heart
and break the power of violence,
we entrust the people of Ukraine to you.

Protect them in this time of peril;
let them know not death but life,
not slavery but freedom.

You are Father of all;
we are brothers and sister.

Give us the strength
to live that truth in love,
choosing peace not war.

Amen.

'We're not the church we were anymore': Fr Joe Caddy VG

Clergy from across the Archdiocese met on Wednesday 30 March for an opportunity to pray and reflect on the Archdiocese's initiative of missionary renewal, *Take the Way of the Gospel*, and how to approach the realities of a post-COVID world and church. It was the first in-person seminar held for clergy in 2022, after Victoria's tumultuous year of COVID lockdowns and restrictions.

Archbishop Peter A Comensoli opened the gathering, thanking the priests for their presence and acknowledging the various challenges and opportunities facing their communities as they continue to open up and reorient themselves to the mission in a post-COVID time. 'It's good to have a large portion of our clergy come together in prayer, formation and fellowship,' said the Archbishop.

Several topics were discussed at the gathering, from the pastoral to the practical, but a key focus of the session was the Take the Way of the Gospel initiative for missionary renewal in the Archdiocese. Sharing the Gospel more effectively

In early 2021, Archbishop Comensoli invited parishes to discern the formation of "parish missions", where a mission represents a family of communities, with commonalities in history, demographics, geography, and with a collaborative focus on evangelisation, worship, formation and outreach.

The Archbishop acknowledged that it was not something new but rather a response to the ever-increasing sense of urgency expressed by clergy and people 'to attend to the manner in which the local communities of our Archdiocese are arranged and function'.

'Undeniably, the landscape of Melbourne—a city of cities—has changed dramatically since the time of [Melbourne's first bishop] Archbishop Goold. What has not changed is the desire of God's people to find new and fresh ways of proclaiming the Gospel into our local communities,' the Archbishop said at the time. It's time to recalibrate.

Speaking to clergy on Wednesday, Fr Joe Caddy AM, Vicar General of the Archdiocese, said that it was now time to recalibrate after the disruption of COVID.

'Over the last 12 months we've welcomed the questions that have come through around Take the Way of the Gospel, particularly for the request for a more formal consultation with clergy and laity to take place,' said Fr Caddy.

He explained that a Project Stakeholder Advisory Group would soon be formed, which will include representation from members of the clergy, laity, leaders from lay ecclesial/migrant communities as well as senior leadership from the Archdiocese. The group's role will be to provide advice and suggestions on the requirements of key stakeholders (parishes, clergy, lay leaders, parish staff) as the Take the Way of the Gospel project progresses.

Fr Caddy also introduced Catherine Garner, who was recently appointed to Take the Way of the Gospel as Program Director – Parish Transformation. Catherine has spent many years in the healthcare sector and was Group Director – Mission and Outreach at Cabrini Health.

In her new role, Catherine will be working directly with parishes and Archdiocesan offices to help revitalise local parish structures for a greater sense of mission and zeal. She shared that she has already begun visiting parishes and has heard varying responses to Take the Way of the Gospel.

'Some of you are wondering where you're going to find the energy to undertake Take the Way of the Gospel,' she said. 'Some of you are already thinking about *how* you can do Take the Way of the Gospel and already started the work of revitalising and re-engaging the mission with your people. And some of you have even said that you just don't know how to expand the walls to fit all the people in your church!'

Melbourne is a mosaic of experiences; there isn't just one experience out there. My role is to connect the vision of what's been presented to us with the reality of what's happening on the ground. It's not going to be easy and we're bound to make mistakes,' she said.

'We'll need to be open, honest and listen to each other. And leave room for the Holy Spirit.'

It has to start with prayerful listening

Each parish will approach Take the Way of the Gospel differently, Fr Caddy acknowledged, saying that not all parishes would be able to move at the same pace. 'That's why the Archbishop toward the end of last year encouraged us to continue the process of prayer and discernment throughout 2022,' he said.

Fr Caddy also spoke of the need for patience, prayer and collaboration as missionary renewal continued to take shape around the Archdiocese. 'We'd have our heads in the sand if we said there isn't going to be grief in this. We're not the church we were anymore and there's undoubtedly grief in that. We have to acknowledge this,' he said.

'There's always a reason not to do it,' Fr Caddy said, reflecting on the inevitable pain that comes with change. 'But [change] is going to happen *to us* if we don't do anything.'

Work is already underway to provide both clergy and the laity with more formal training opportunities in the areas of leadership, pastoral care and administration. Fr Caddy also suggested that a deeper understanding of ecclesiology would be required.

Pope Francis talks about our role in inviting people into an encounter with Jesus, and with others ... We are community-builders. This whole thing is about vibrancy and bringing people together,' he said.

'Clergy and laypeople need to discern what this will look like together,' said Fr Caddy. 'But it has to start with prayerful listening to each other. It has to be synodal.'



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




Speaking to your Children about their School Day

Many parents/guardians relay the challenges they face when asking their child/ren about their day at school, often because children don't talk about their experiences, or give a broad comment like "It was good".

Below are some 'open' phrased questions for parents/guardians to use (one-two question a day) to help generate conversations with their children.

Try one or more of these 10 questions next week and see how your child responds:



1. What was the best thing you did today and why?
2. What was something different that happened today?
3. What made you laugh?
4. Who did you play with?
5. What are you looking forward to about tomorrow?
6. What did you learn about in Drama/PE/STEM?
7. What's something your teacher said to you today that made you think?
