

Message From Fr. Maurie

Greetings to all!

What a week of 'impending weather events' as I heard it called early on, and now the impact! I went across to Brimbank Park to have a look at the Maribyrnong River – the 30-metre ford crossing that I've walked across so many times is somewhere beneath a 400-metre wide torrent rushing across what are usually play areas remote from the river's course!

In a quite different way it has been some week for our young people at Catholic Regional College Sydenham! The final day of school on Thursday, and gathering in St Patrick's Cathedral tonight (Friday) for their final celebration together as CRC and the graduation ceremonies. What a great stage in their lives for themselves, their families and the staff of our four CRCs – St Albans, North Keilor, Caroline Springs.

At a more mundane level, I bought my 2023 diary during the week. Perhaps I should have done that a few weeks ago, to avoid the risk of losing those notes that were doing the job for a while.

In a sider space, it's Caulfield Cup tomorrow and that means Melbourne Cup in a few weeks.

And one of our Schools has asked if I'll participate in one of their Staff Development forums to explore the meanings of Advent.

It seems so early to be getting ready to say 'farewell' to 2022; however, 'the march of time ...'.

A change came this week to the COVID-safe regulations. For Parishes, this means that masks are no longer required for Ministers of Holy Communion at Mass.

Of course, everyone who prefers to continue wearing masks may continue to do so. We will continue to have hand-sanitising available in the foyers of our churches.

Importantly, COVID remains amongst us. With those further easing of regulations, it is so important to be mindful of our own health and the impact that can have on others. Stay careful, be thoughtful!

In our churches this weekend we enter the second week of the review and renewal of our Thanksgiving – which is just about the sole source of income for our Parish. We haven't talked about this for over five years, and need not talk about it again for several years if this current process goes well. There are a reminder page and the initial brochure attached with this email.

This weekend's Readings explore some aspects of 'praying'. That's a fundamental essential for us, isn't it – relating with god 'who is real and really part of our lives'.

There's an interesting article attached with this email, in which the writer raises 8 points for consideration. In summary, they are:

o we do not pray simply to effect our salvation in heaven. We pray to keep on mission with Christ in the world.

Take it easy! And may the presence of God's Spirit amongst us guide us to shape our lives as people of faith, hope and good works!

Through writing the book, I came to eight conclusions:

1. One of the reasons some of us give up on prayer is because **we may not have been introduced to its riches**. Prayer is making space for God to love us, for us to hear that and then, through the community of faith, to have the courage to return the compliment. It changes lives.

2. The best of prayer engages our vivid imaginations and a vast array of biblical images to develop a set of ideas that reflect various personal theologies that will suit every season under the sun. **One size does not fit all.** This enables us to enter more deeply into a relationship with God who accompanies us through the events of our lives.

3. We pray because prayer is not just about asking for something for someone, somewhere. Intercessory prayer is important given that **it asks an unchanging God to change us to change the world**, but prayer helps to see that the Psalms are in fact a workshop showing us how to explore other deeply human responses to the divine: praising and giving thanks; crying out in lamentation; affirming our trust and faith; singing of our salvation; and simply waiting upon the Lord.

4. Building on the Scriptures, **our Christian heritage has given us a supermarket of ideas, styles, insights, challenges and ways and means to God**. For many people, the schools of prayer provide a history, framework, discipline, meaning and structure to their communication with God and one another. It connects them to something that has stood the test of time and helped millions of people not just to have deeper prayer lives, but to transform their community for the better by how they have lived.

5. No matter what image, response or school of prayer we find helpful, **Christian prayer is centred on a person**, **Jesus**. Through him we are invited into a loving and saving relationship with the Father, Son and Spirit, that has consequences for how we live in this world and the next. In this relationship, nothing is wasted in our often complex lives. We are invited to grow from where we are, and to realise our full potential. Prayer helps face down fear, and live in hope. And when we feel distant from Jesus, guess who has moved away from whom? Our prayer is not about appeasing an angry God. There is nothing that can ever, or will ever, stop God from loving us.

6. Because Christian faith is personal but never private, then **public prayer matters because I am not just saved as an individual, but we are saved as the People of God**. We need each other to rise to that invitation as we come together to pray in an assembly that stands before mystery in awe and wonder, is hospitable and expresses ancient faith in a contemporary world. In the sacraments, God's greatness meets our frailty.

7. **Mary and the saints show us how it is done** and always lead us to Christ. And most of us need all the help we can get; we need role models who have said yes as they made their own pilgrimage of faith and hung in there when the going got tough, especially when they touched their own personal, spiritual and sometimes material poverty.

8. Prayer comes at a price. **We do not pray simply to effect our salvation in heaven. We pray to keep on mission with Christ in the world**. Our lives may be the only Bible some people will ever read. Our living of the virtues and our commitment to justice and peace may be the only sacraments some people ever witness and celebrate. They might decide whether to bother praying on the basis of what they hear but even more on what they see. Our prayer is not judged on how we feel, but on how we live and what we say away from prayer. Though we all fail, prayerful people are traced with Christ's life as a result of the encounter with him and so are compassionate, hopeful, joyful, grateful, forgiving and loving. The Church and the world need prayerful people more than ever before.



We trank them: The lockdowns and other restrictions brought to us by COVID-19 have forced us to become somewhat disconnected. 

This will require new investment in staff and resources, as well as YOUR support - bringing your energy, talent, and commitment as we continue to reinvigorate our Parish Ministries after the last two years dominated by COVID-19. As we look into the next few years, several areas of need for our Parish show up:

- We have to build up all Ministry Groups throughout the Parish, recruiting new members and providing training, formation and support to all.
- Increasing population in the Parish requires us to develop more ways of presenting and engaging with Parish life. Due to the decline of Priests in our Archdiocese, it is unlikely we will have a second Priest appointed to our Parish. We will require a pastoral support person Sacred Heart and Emmaus churches are due for

preventative maintenance – with the Parish Office/ Presbytery requiring some necessary major structural work in addition to preventative measures

 The primary financial support for our Parish is our Thanksgiving contributions. In this process of Thanksgiving contributions, it is our shared responsibility to maintain and grow further the life of our Parish

Dear Cana Families,

As you are aware, Cana is committed to the safety and wellbeing of all its students. Like all Catholic schools, Cana is governed by Child Safety Standards. The Child Safety Standards were established for organisations to create a culture of safety by adopting and actioning strategies to keep children safe from harm.

Standard 3 of the Child Safety Standards, Child and Student Empowerment, highlights the rights of students to establish protective factors. Some of the protective factors include, but are not limited to, your child knowing what to do when he/she feels unsafe, pathways for your child should they wish to raise concerns of safety, which includes the online environment.

In Term 4, an educative safety program will be delivered from Prep to Grade 6 called the **Daniel Morcombe Child Safety Curriculum**.

Students will learn within this program how to recognise, react and report if they feel unsafe. Students will also identify private body parts using anatomical names with reference to body ownership. The research evidence tells us that this is a protective factor that increases student's ability to unambiguously communicate the nature of harm they might experience and seek help.

All sessions will be delivered by your child's teacher within an age-appropriate approach and in a safe and inclusive environment.

Enlightened by faith and the words of Jesus who said, 'I have come that you may have life, and have it to the full' (John 10:10) we at Cana, have a responsibility to ensure that all children in our school community are safe and have every opportunity to flourish.

Rationale

This Cana Catholic Primary School Parent Code of Conduct outlines the way in which our community requires all parents/carers and family members to conduct themselves when visiting our school, and communicating with students, staff and other parents in our school.

The Cana Catholic PS Parent Code of Conduct applies to all adults including parents, guardians, carers, step-parents, grandparents, extended family while involved in activities or communication related to Cana Catholic Primary School.

The School Policy & Advisory Guide, 'Visitors in Schools' requires all visitors to the school during school hours to sign a visitors' register located at the school office, so that their presence in the school is recorded for Child Safety reasons and in the event of an emergency. (excluding Mass and Interschool Sports)

When at school and within the proximity of the school

Parents/Carers will:

- use courteous and acceptable language when communicating with their own children, other students, staff and other parents/carers and members of the school community. There will be zero tolerance to any verbal or physical violence towards others.
- value our diverse community and respect the rights and practices of individuals and their families.
- respect points of view that are different from their own.
- firstly, speak directly to the teacher with any concerns regarding incidents in the school. The teacher will then refer the
 parent to appropriate staff if necessary.
- be mindful of the teacher's time, when wanting to communicate with them. Make a time to meet that does not disrupt the class unless there is a genuine emergency.
- listen respectfully, in the same manner required of students and staff when attending school assembly or informal/formal meetings.
- provide appropriate parental supervision before the bell in the morning and in the afternoon (3.15pm onwards Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, 3.00pm on Tuesdays).
- remove their child from a situation that involves any form of violence and seek support from staff members.
- model positive behaviours in front of all students at all times, whether on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- comply with the school onsite parking expectations, with road safety rules and parking signs when dropping off or picking up their children to and from school.
- comply with the Cana Catholic PS Attendance Policy (refer to Cana's website).
- ensure that your child complies with the Cana's School Uniform Policy (refer to Cana website).
- respect all Cana's policies and procedures (refer to Cana's website).
- Respect the privacy of teachers.

Unacceptable Behaviour

Parents/Carers will not:

- discipline a child who is not theirs or speak to a child who is not theirs about that child's behaviour. This is the role of teaching staff. Being approached by an adult they do not know, can be distressing for children. Common sense would prevail if safety was an issue.
- use offensive language towards their own children, students, staff and other parents/carers and members of the school community when on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- interrupt or distract a teacher while classroom instruction or learning activities are underway.
- engage with staff, students or parents/carers in an aggressive manner regarding issues of a personal or school nature.
- engage in inappropriate physical contact with students, staff or other parents/carers.
- discriminate between or disrespect any member of our school community.
- disrupt the good order of the school by any means including: in person, via persons representing them or social media.
- Engage a teacher about school matters outside the school environment.

When making a complaint

Parents have the right to raise issues and concerns related to the education/welfare of their child or other school matters.

There are a number of ways you can raise any concerns you have about your child. You can:

- write a note or email your child's teacher outlining your concerns
- make an appointment to speak on the phone or in person with the class teacher or Wellbeing Coordinator; ensuring that you inform the school about the issue you wish to discuss
- consider speaking with the school's student wellbeing Coordinator/Leader if you feel that is appropriate
- arrange any meeting times or phone calls through the school office (this is more convenient for both you and your child's teacher and does not interrupt teachers during the time they need to be with their students)

Remember that the class teacher together with others who may be involved, should be given a reasonable amount of time to take the steps required to resolve or address your concerns.

Consequences of a Breach of Cana's Parent Code of Conduct

Any parent, member of school staff or student may notify the Principal of a possible breach of the Cana Parent Code of Conduct. The Principal will investigate the complaint and if satisfied that a breach has occurred will:

- A meeting may be terminated at any time if there is a breach of conduct
- provide a first and final warning that a breach of the Cana Code of Conduct has occurred and that a further breach will not be tolerated 🔛
- issue a trespass warning to the parent if the behaviour was one of an aggressive manner. If the behaviour continues, may
 accelerate to a trespass notice prohibiting the parent from coming on school grounds for a designated period of time,
 determined by the Principal or their representative in line with DET guidelines

Regular review

This document will be reviewed every year in consultations with parent representatives, and following significant incidents if they occur. We will ensure that families have the opportunity to contribute. Where possible we do our best to work with local Aboriginal communities, culturally and/or linguistically diverse communities and people with a disability.
