STEM Resources

Our STEM program has received new coding resources for Prep to Grade Six. These are Bee-Bots and Sphero devices. Please see below for a brief outline of each resource along with some photos of Cana students using them in their learning:



Bee-bot:

Bee-bots are programmable floor robots and are an excellent way to introduce students to the basic concepts of coding. Students are able to learn directional language, commands, sequencing and problem solving.

Sphero:


Sphero robots are educational tools that transform the way students learn to create and invent through coding. The device connects with the SpheroEDU app where students are able to use different platforms of coding to program the Sphero device.



We thank the Parents and Friends Committee for generously donating these new resources to our STEM program. Money raised through school fundraisers helped with the purchasing of these items.

STEM Club

Over Term 4, students from Prep to Grade 4 participated in a lunch time STEM club. The focus of the STEM club was to create a city using recycled resources. Students worked collaboratively across the year levels to design and create a city. Once the construction was completed, students coded the Bee-Bots to travel around the city. A big thank-you to Dr Loz from Science Play Kidz for providing us with the recycled resources for our city. The students had lots of fun!

Message From Fr. Maurie

Hello everyone

This 'long weekend' is the chance to 'take a deep breath' for the run into Christmas, I reckon: once the Melbourne Cup is run next Tuesday, we head to Christmas and all the end-of-year lead ups that come into play.

Not only have Christmas things been in the shops for a while, I saw in one during the week a 'back to school 2023' sign. Someone commented 'if you're getting hot and cross about all this, wait a moment and the hot cross buns will be out to sustain you!'

And things continue in their course, too, of course.

One of those is for our VCE young people. Over these weekends we're including in our Prayers of the Faithful at Masses the words: "We pray for our young people who have commenced their VCE and university exams, and for their families. Keep them confident in their abilities, relieve any anxiety they feel, and keep them hopeful always about the future: Lord, hear us": AMEN to that!

This weekend's Gospel Reading holds the story of Zacchaeus' meeting with Jesus. There are many layers: conversion and change of heart, honesty, humility, hardness of heart, social justice. The crowd criticise Jesus: "He has gone as a guest to the house of a sinner." At each Mass just before sharing the Meal of Eucharist we say 'Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof' and He comes anyway: here is the story of Zacchaeus in action!

The First Reading for the day puts it this way: "Because you are almighty, you are merciful to all; you overlook sins and give your children time to repent."

As one of the Prefaces says: "You do not cease to spur us on to possess a more abundant life, and, being rich in mercy, you constantly offer pardon and call on sinners to trust in your forgiveness."

See an attachment with this email for a further reflection on the Zacchaeus story.

During the coming week we move into November. That is traditionally the month when we remember in hope those who have died and passed into the new life of resurrection. See the newsheet attached with this email for details of Masses that will be held next weekend at Keilor and Altona cemeteries. We will have the customary 'November book' for names to be recorded whom we will hold in Masses during the month.

In the newssheet, there is also information of a way to reach out to those suffering because of the floods: the St Vincent de Paul Society (Vinnies) have branches all through the affected areas.

There is an attachment, too, that follows up our review and renewal of Thanksgiving. Thank you to all who have participated so far! This is an essential way in which we show our responsibility together for our Parish. Please consider: include our Parish as part of your 'essential spending' – and consider keeping that contribution up with the costs of Parish life that have increased since we last had a renewal five years ago!

REFLECTION

GUESS WHO'S COMING TO DINNER!!

Think back to last week's gospel: the Pharisee who got God wrong the thought he had to prove himself to God), and the Tax Collector who got God right [he acknowledged his weaknesses and sin, and trustingly called on God to forgive him).

This week's story of Zacchaeus acts out the teaching of last Sunday's parable and repeats its message. Jesus comes to Jericho, and of all the people in that village, he singles out the one most in need, the senior tax collector. Jesus gives himself to Zacchaeus, just as he now is. He imposes no conditions and simply says, "Come down, it is necessary that I stay at your house today". The necessity is caused by Zacchaeus' neediness. Jesus responds to him and offers to eat with him, the village outcast. In response to Jesus' offer, Zacchaeus changes. He recognises the utter generosity of God and makes the only appropriate response, humble gratitude and generosity in return. In the gift, its reception and the generous response Jesus recognises salvation has happened for Zacchaeus.

As part of Jesus' mission to seek out the poor and the lost jas we were told at the beginning of this Gospel of Luke early this year), he must find a home with the social and religious outcasts.

In our neediness and poverty (of spirit, of faith, of charity) may we continue to place our hope in the gracious generosity of God. Let's reflect on the words of today's Responsorial Psalm:

> The Lord is kind and full of compassion, slow to anger, abounding in love. How good is the Lord to all. compassionate to all his creatures.

Zacchaeus - another one of 'the outsiders' recognised by Jesus

Through the gospel of Luke that we have been listening to each weekend over several months we have been following the journey of Jesus towards Jerusalem. In today's gospel, Jesus has drawn very near now – Jericho is just a short distance from Jerusalem – and he is moving steadily closer to the Passion of his final days.

Into the story this weekend comes Zacchaeus, keen as the rest of Jericho to see this Jesus as he passes through the town. However, because he is so short he can't see through the crowd, and because he is a despised tax collector no one was going to make room for him to see. He is so curious/interested/eager that he climbs a tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus.

And here he is, another one in this Gospel of Luke whom others might think is an 'outsider': think of last week's tax collector at prayer in the Temple – who goes home 'at rights with God'; think of the lepers of a few weeks age, shunned and expelled from the city; think of the Samaritan (religious enemies of the Jewish people) who went to the help of the traveller who had been attacked. The Zacchaeus story, too, recognises that faith lives in all sorts of ways in all sorts of people.

(Tax collectors were hated by most Jews at the time of Jesus. Firstly, the taxes they collected were going to support Rome – a foreign, Gentile power that was an unwelcome occupying force in Palestine. The Jews' taxes were paying the wages of the army that occupied their country, so tax collectors were seen as collaborators with the enemy. Secondly, the system of tax collection lent itself to abuse and corruption. Tax collectors were required to collect a certain amount from their district; any excess they collected was theirs to keep – that was their income.)

Like other characters in the gospel, Zacchaeus' determination to catch sight of Jesus is an indication of his openness to the message of Jesus. This prompts him to welcome Jesus into his home. The readiness of Jesus to enter into the house of someone regarded as a sinner causes great scandal among the onlookers. What's more, Jesus is prepared to eat with this man as well – a sign of complete acceptance. (How reassuring is this when we consider our own approach to the great Meal of Eucharist!)

Jesus declares that Zacchaeus is a person of faith. Jesus' words are directed to the crowd, not Zacchaeus. They are so determined to draw lines between those who are acceptable and those who are not that they have failed to notice what Jesus has taught all along – that faith can flourish in all people and is not determined by their social status.

Later in this chapter of Luke there is the account of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem – which we read on Palm Sunday. In that incident, Jesus is welcomed into Jerusalem by cheering crowds. Those same crowds, just days later, were yelling for Jesus to be crucified. In the Zacchaeus passage, the crowds line the streets to welcome Jesus and then also quickly turn on him when he acts out the message of acceptance and forgiveness that he has been proclaiming throughout his ministry.

When we hear this story about Zacchaeus, we can readily notice the conversion that takes place within Zacchaeus. It is also the muttering, grumbling crowd who are called to conversion, called to soften their hearts and see a faithful man where they have previously only seen a sinner. Throughout the Gospel of Luke, the welcome and acceptance Jesus extends to the 'outsider' and the 'sinner' confronts and challenges those who would hold themselves up as being better than these others.

Dear Cana Families,

As you are aware, Cana is committed to the safety and wellbeing of all its students. Like all Catholic schools, Cana is governed by Child Safety Standards. The Child Safety Standards were established for organisations to create a culture of safety by adopting and actioning strategies to keep children safe from harm.

Standard 3 of the Child Safety Standards, Child and Student Empowerment, highlights the rights of students to establish protective factors. Some of the protective factors include, but are not limited to, your child knowing what to do when he/she feels unsafe, pathways for your child should they wish to raise concerns of safety, which includes the online environment.

In Term 4, an educative safety program will be delivered from Prep to Grade 6 called the Daniel Morcombe Child Safety Curriculum.

Students will learn within this program how to recognise, react and report if they feel unsafe. Students will also identify private body parts using anatomical names with reference to body ownership. The research evidence tells us that this is a protective factor that increases student's ability to unambiguously communicate the nature of harm they might experience and seek help.

All sessions will be delivered by your child's teacher within an age-appropriate approach and in a safe and inclusive environment.

Enlightened by faith and the words of Jesus who said, 'I have come that you may have life, and have it to the full' (John 10:10) we at Cana, have a responsibility to ensure that all children in our school community are safe and have every opportunity to flourish.

Cana Catholic Primary School has a commitment to the care, safety and wellbeing of children.

Rationale

This Cana Catholic Primary School Parent Code of Conduct outlines the way in which our community requires all parents/carers and family members to conduct themselves when visiting our school, and communicating with students, staff and other parents in our school.

The Cana Catholic PS Parent Code of Conduct applies to all adults including parents, guardians, carers, step-parents, grandparents, extended family while involved in activities or communication related to Cana Catholic Primary School.

The School Policy & Advisory Guide, 'Visitors in Schools' requires all visitors to the school during school hours to sign a visitors' register located at the school office, so that their presence in the school is recorded for Child Safety reasons and in the event of an emergency. (excluding Mass and Interschool Sports)

When at school and within the proximity of the school

Parents/Carers will:

- use courteous and acceptable language when communicating with their own children, other students, staff and other
 parents/carers and members of the school community. There will be zero tolerance to any verbal or physical violence
 towards others.
- value our diverse community and respect the rights and practices of individuals and their families.
- respect points of view that are different from their own.
- firstly, speak directly to the teacher with any concerns regarding incidents in the school. The teacher will then refer the parent to appropriate staff if necessary.
- be mindful of the teacher's time, when wanting to communicate with them. Make a time to meet that does not disrupt the class unless there is a genuine emergency.
- listen respectfully, in the same manner required of students and staff when attending school assembly or informal/formal meetings.
- provide appropriate parental supervision before the bell in the morning and in the afternoon (3.15pm onwards Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, 3.00pm on Tuesdays).
- remove their child from a situation that involves any form of violence and seek support from staff members.
- model positive behaviours in front of all students at all times, whether on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- comply with the school onsite parking expectations, with road safety rules and parking signs when dropping off or picking up their children to and from school.
- comply with the Cana Catholic PS Attendance Policy (refer to Cana's website).
- ensure that your child complies with the Cana's School Uniform Policy (refer to Cana website).
- respect all Cana's policies and procedures (refer to Cana's website).
- Respect the privacy of teachers.

Unacceptable Behaviour

Parents/Carers will not:

• discipline a child who is not theirs or speak to a child who is not theirs about that child's behaviour. This is the role of teaching staff. Being approached by an adult they do not know, can be distressing for children. Common sense would prevail if safety was an issue.

- use offensive language towards their own children, students, staff and other parents/carers and members of the school community when on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- interrupt or distract a teacher while classroom instruction or learning activities are underway.
- engage with staff, students or parents/carers in an aggressive manner regarding issues of a personal or school nature.
- engage in inappropriate physical contact with students, staff or other parents/carers.
- discriminate between or disrespect any member of our school community.
- disrupt the good order of the school by any means including: in person, via persons representing them or social media.
- Engage a teacher about school matters outside the school environment.

When making a complaint

Parents have the right to raise issues and concerns related to the education/welfare of their child or other school matters.

There are a number of ways you can raise any concerns you have about your child. You can:

- write a note or email your child's teacher outlining your concerns
- make an appointment to speak on the phone or in person with the class teacher or Wellbeing Coordinator; ensuring that you inform the school about the issue you wish to discuss
- consider speaking with the school's student wellbeing Coordinator/Leader if you feel that is appropriate
- arrange any meeting times or phone calls through the school office (this is more convenient for both you and your child's teacher and does not interrupt teachers during the time they need to be with their students)

Remember that the class teacher together with others who may be involved, should be given a reasonable amount of time to take the steps required to resolve or address your concerns.

Consequences of a Breach of Cana's Parent Code of Conduct

Any parent, member of school staff or student may notify the Principal of a possible breach of the Cana Parent Code of Conduct. The Principal will investigate the complaint and if satisfied that a breach has occurred will:

- A meeting may be terminated at any time if there is a breach of conduct
- provide a first and final warning that a breach of the Cana Code of Conduct has occurred and that a further breach will not be tolerated
- issue a trespass warning to the parent if the behaviour was one of an aggressive manner. If the behaviour continues, may accelerate to a trespass notice prohibiting the parent from coming on school grounds for a designated period of time, determined by the Principal or their representative in line with DET guidelines

Regular review

This document will be reviewed every year in consultations with parent representatives, and following significant incidents if they occur. We will ensure that families have the opportunity to contribute. Where possible we do our best to work with local Aboriginal communities, culturally and/or linguistically diverse communities and people with a disability.

Camps Sports and Excursion Fund Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) provides financial support to eligible families so students can attend school camps, outdoor education and sporting programs, as well as incursions and excursions. If you have not applied for CSEF and hold a currently valid Healthcare Card, or if you have an existing card and a new child is joining Cana, please let the office know.
