

Cana Catholic Primary School has a commitment to the care, safety and wellbeing of children.



#### **Rationale**

This Cana Catholic Primary School Parent Code of Conduct outlines the way in which our community requires all parents/carers and family members to conduct themselves when visiting our school, and communicating with students, staff and other parents in our school.

The Cana Catholic PS Parent Code of Conduct applies to all adults including parents, guardians, carers, step-parents, grandparents, extended family while involved in activities or communication related to Cana Catholic Primary School.

The School Policy & Advisory Guide, 'Visitors in Schools' requires all visitors to the school during school hours to sign a visitors' register located at the school office, so that their presence in the school is recorded for Child Safety reasons and in the event of an emergency. (excluding Mass and Interschool Sports)

#### When at school and within the proximity of the school

#### Parents/Carers will:

- use courteous and acceptable language when communicating with their own children, other students, staff and other
  parents/carers and members of the school community. There will be zero tolerance to any verbal or physical violence
  towards others.
- value our diverse community and respect the rights and practices of individuals and their families.
- respect points of view that are different from their own.
- firstly, speak directly to the teacher with any concerns regarding incidents in the school. The teacher will then refer the parent to appropriate staff if necessary.
- be mindful of the teacher's time, when wanting to communicate with them. Make a time to meet that does not disrupt the class unless there is a genuine emergency.
- listen respectfully, in the same manner required of students and staff when attending school assembly or informal/formal meetings.
- provide appropriate parental supervision before the bell in the morning and in the afternoon (3.15pm onwards Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday).
- remove their child from a situation that involves any form of violence and seek support from staff members.
- model positive behaviours in front of all students at all times, whether on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- comply with the school onsite parking expectations, with road safety rules and parking signs when dropping off or picking up their children to and from school.
- comply with the Cana Catholic PS Attendance Policy and to use the SkoolBag App. (refer to Cana's website).
- ensure that your child complies with the Cana's School Uniform Policy (refer to Cana website).
- respect all Cana's policies and procedures (refer to Cana's website).
- Respect the privacy of teachers.

#### **Unacceptable Behaviour**

Parents/Carers will not:

- discipline a child who is not theirs or speak to a child who is not theirs about that child's behaviour. This is the role of the teaching staff. Being approached by an adult they do not know, can be distressing for children. Common sense would prevail if safety was an issue.
- use offensive language towards their own children, students, staff and other parents/carers and members of the school community when on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- interrupt or distract a teacher while classroom instruction or learning activities are underway.
- engage with staff, students or parents/carers in an aggressive manner regarding issues of a personal or school nature.
- engage in inappropriate physical contact with students, staff or other parents/carers.
- discriminate between or disrespect any member of our school community.
- disrupt the good order of the school by any means including: in person, via persons representing them or social media.
- Engage with a teacher about school matters outside the school environment.

#### When making a complaint

Parents have the right to raise issues and concerns related to the education/welfare of their child or other school matters.

There are a number of ways you can raise any concerns you have about your child. You can:

- · write a note or email your child's teacher outlining your concerns
- make an appointment to speak on the phone or in person with the class teacher or Wellbeing Coordinator; ensuring that you inform the school about the issue you wish to discuss
- consider speaking with the school's student wellbeing Coordinator/Leader if you feel that is appropriate
- arrange any meeting times or phone calls through the school office (this is more convenient for both you and your child's teacher and does not interrupt teachers during the time they need to be with their students)

Remember that the class teacher together with others who may be involved, should be given a reasonable amount of time to take the steps required to resolve or address your concerns.

#### Consequences of a Breach of Cana's Parent Code of Conduct

Any parent, member of school staff or student may notify the Principal of a possible breach of the Cana Parent Code of Conduct. The Principal will investigate the complaint and if satisfied that a breach has occurred will:

- A meeting may be terminated at any time if there is a breach of conduct
- provide a first and final warning that a breach of the Cana Code of Conduct has occurred and that a further breach will not be tolerated [5]
- issue a trespass warning to the parent if the behaviour was one of an aggressive manner. If the behaviour continues, may accelerate to a trespass notice prohibiting the parent from coming on school grounds for a designated period of time, determined by the Principal or their representative in line with MACS and DET guidelines

#### Regular review

This document will be reviewed every year in consultations with parent representatives, and following significant incidents if they occur. We will ensure that families have the opportunity to contribute. Where possible we do our best to work with local Aboriginal communities, culturally and/or linguistically diverse communities and people with a disability.

#### Message from Fr. Maurie

#### Hello everyone!

What a terrific response came in to our annual Ministry Recruitment at Masses last weekend from both Emmaus and Sacred Heart! I'll indicate the overall numbers in next week's Letter. What a great expression of our shared understanding that it's 'us together' who give life to our Parish. We know the ways to do that as we appreciate that Ministry is about "carrying forward the work of Christ under the lead of the befriending Spirit".

When I mentioned this response to a friend of mine during the week, he remembered what we (Priests) were told by the leader of the retreat we made just prior to our ordination in 1974: "I'm very glad to be gathering with those young men on whom the future of the Church does not depend!" Yes, it's the people's Church, it's the Holy Spirit's Church!! There will be an opportunity to register for Ministry at Masses this weekend for those who weren't with us last weekend. And there's an attachment with the email for you to use, too.

After the weekend, we will close this round of Ministry Recruitment. Lauren in our Parish Office will process all the information, liaise with the Leaders of the Ministry Groups, ensure that everyone is complying with those regulations about a Working With Children Card, and design sets of rosters.

Last Sunday afternoon I took a long walk through Brimbank, and compared the photos I took during the floods with the scene now. I was on the path alongside the river and was looking hard up to see the debris from the floods still hanging in the branches of huge trees towering above. How much water had been in this place where I was standing!! And being replaced by more as the river raged along! I imagined trying to explain that to someone who was unaware of how those floods were!

Which had me thinking about the potential the space where I was standing has for holding what can hardly be imagined!!

Which brought to mind that statistic we're told that we use only 10% of our brain. (However, when I googled it, that figure was debunked: we may use small parts of our brain at various times of the day for different experiences were involved in: overall we're using lots of our brainpower across the day.)

This had me thinking about the Season of Lent that we are about to enter – Ash Wednesday is coming up (next Wednesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> February: Masses at 7.30am and 7.00pm at Sacred Heart, and at 7pm at Emmaus). The connection I made between my thoughts about potential and Lent is that it is the season when we reflect on our potential to live with an awareness that God is real and really part of our lives, and live up to that awareness in the shape we give to our lives in all aspects, situations, relationships. In the Season it is a good thing to notice that we do indeed live out this awareness. And the whole dynamic is about identifying the potential we have for more of that – by ridding ourselves of actions, attitudes, bad habits that block us from developing into that potential. That's what 'giving up something for Lent' is about - and then replacing that with something that develops us more in living the life of faith that we have in common.

This story comes to mind:

Mary Alice had potential. It was the first thing anyone noticed when they met her. 'Mary Allice, "they would say, "You've got great potential!"

After a while, Mary Alice became concerned. "What if I should lose my potential?" she thought.

So ... Mary Alice kept her potential stuffed under the mattress. However she soon discovered that the lump under the mattress made it difficult to sleep.

Mary Alice packed up her potential and took it to a bank on the far side of town. She rented a large safe-deposit box and locked her potential away in the vault.

Then, on the third Tuesday of every month, Mary Alice would visit her potential. Cautiously she would peek into the box. Then she locked it up again and stored her potential safely back in the vault.

Feeling quite content, Mary Alice would take the bus home, secure in the knowledge that, if nothing else, she would always have POTENTIAL!

Have a good Lent!

#### REFLECTION

#### LENT BEGINS WITH ASH WEDNESDAY THIS WEEK – 22<sup>nd</sup> February

Lent is the preparation period for the most important feast of the Church year – the life-deathresurrection of Jesus that we celebrate during Holy Week to Easter. Our Church has three standard areas of life suggested for our attention and participation during Lent:

Prayer – for example, celebrating Mass some more times than usual; praying at home a little more than usual, reading some passages from the Bible and using that in prayer, and ......

Self-denial – for example, giving up some favourite thing, and using that discipline to remind yourself of the spiritual life we share, and our call to charity to others, ....

Helping others – for example, giving extra attention to someone who is poor, sick lonely, worried, .... As a 'frame' for Lent, our Church advises us to make Ash Wednesday and Good Friday days of both fasting and of 'abstinence from meat' as signals and reminders of the significance of the Season and the preparation for Easter. (Further details of the Church's teaching are on the noticeboards.)

PROJECT COMPASSION: is the ready opportunity during Lent to reach beyond ourselves to the lives of people in need: boxes and envelopes to take home are available in the foyers - the money you put aside in them will be forwarded to the Church's outreach arm 'Caritas Australia'.

# FOR THE INFORMATION OF PARISHIONERS LENT 2023

- 109. The Lenten season has a twofold character:
  - it recalls baptism or prepares for it;
  - it stresses a penitential spirit.

By these means especially, Lent readies the faithful for celebrating the paschal mystery after a period of closer attention to the Word of God, and more ardent prayer. In the liturgy itself and in the liturgy-centred instructions, these baptismal and penitential themes should be more pronounced. Hence:

- a) Wider use is to be made of baptismal features proper to the Lenten liturgy...
- b) The same approach holds for the penitential elements...
- 110. During Lent, penance should not be only internal and individual but also external and social...
  In any event, let the paschal fast be kept sacred. It should be observed everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the resurrection may be visited on uplifted and responsive spirits.

Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Vatican II

#### Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat.

On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

- (a) Prayer -for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary; or in other ways.
- (b) Self-Denial for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country or elsewhere; or in other ways. Project Compassion is a major means of expressing our self-denial in Australia.
- (c) Helping Others for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or overburdened; or in other ways.
- All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast.
   All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain (Canon 1252).
- The Season of Lent is a time of penance. During this season the faithful are exhorted to devote themselves in a special manner to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, and to deny themselves.
- Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled between Ash Wednesday, 22 February 2023 and Trinity Sunday, 4 June 2023 unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time during the year.
- The wonderful gift of the Lord's merciful love is offered in a special way in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
   Lent is a most appropriate time to receive this Sacrament.
   All the faithful who have reached the age of discretion are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at least once a year.

HOLY WEEK - The 2023 Ordo contains instructions for the Rites of Holy Week.

<u>FUNERALS</u> — On Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday all Masses for the Dead, including Funeral Masses, **are forbidden**. Funerals on these days are celebrated with the Liturgy of the Word and without the Eucharistic Sacrifice.

<u>WEDDINGS</u> - Weddings should be discouraged during the Easter Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday. Should a couple be particularly insistent on a wedding for one of these days, then please indicate that no decorations (including flowers), no music nor Nuptial Mass will be permitted.
