
We have had great fun with my superstars and have gotten positive feedback from their guardians.

Cana Catholic Primary School has a commitment to the care, safety and wellbeing of children.

## Rationale

This Cana Catholic Primary School Parent Code of Conduct outlines the way in which our community requires all parents/carers and family members to conduct themselves when visiting our school, and communicating with students, staff and other parents in our school.

The Cana Catholic PS Parent Code of Conduct applies to all adults including parents, guardians, carers, step-parents, grandparents, extended family while involved in activities or communication related to Cana Catholic Primary School.

The School Policy & Advisory Guide, 'Visitors in Schools' requires all visitors to the school during school hours to sign a visitors' register located at the school office, so that their presence in the school is recorded for Child Safety reasons and in the event of an emergency. (excluding Mass and Interschool Sports)

## When at school and within the proximity of the school

#### Parents/Carers will:

- use courteous and acceptable language when communicating with their own children, other students, staff and other
  parents/carers and members of the school community. There will be zero tolerance to any verbal or physical violence
  towards others.
- value our diverse community and respect the rights and practices of individuals and their families.
- respect points of view that are different from their own.
- firstly, speak directly to the teacher with any concerns regarding incidents in the school. The teacher will then refer the parent to appropriate staff if necessary.
- be mindful of the teacher's time, when wanting to communicate with them. Make a time to meet that does not disrupt the class unless there is a genuine emergency.
- listen respectfully, in the same manner required of students and staff when attending school assembly or informal/formal meetings.
- provide appropriate parental supervision before the bell in the morning and in the afternoon (3.15pm onwards Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday).
- remove their child from a situation that involves any form of violence and seek support from staff members.
- model positive behaviours in front of all students at all times, whether on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- comply with the school onsite parking expectations, with road safety rules and parking signs when dropping off or picking up their children to and from school.
- comply with the Cana Catholic PS Attendance Policy and to use the SkoolBag App. (refer to Cana's website).
- ensure that your child complies with the Cana's School Uniform Policy (refer to Cana website).
- respect all Cana's policies and procedures (refer to Cana's website).
- Respect the privacy of teachers.

### **Unacceptable Behaviour**

Parents/Carers will not:

- discipline a child who is not theirs or speak to a child who is not theirs about that child's behaviour. This is the role of the teaching staff. Being approached by an adult they do not know, can be distressing for children. Common sense would prevail if safety was an issue.
- use offensive language towards their own children, students, staff and other parents/carers and members of the school community when on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- interrupt or distract a teacher while classroom instruction or learning activities are underway.
- engage with staff, students or parents/carers in an aggressive manner regarding issues of a personal or school nature.
- engage in inappropriate physical contact with students, staff or other parents/carers.
- discriminate between or disrespect any member of our school community.
- disrupt the good order of the school by any means including: in person, via persons representing them or social media.
- Engage with a teacher about school matters outside the school environment.

## When making a complaint

Parents have the right to raise issues and concerns related to the education/welfare of their child or other school matters.

There are a number of ways you can raise any concerns you have about your child. You can:

- · write a note or email your child's teacher outlining your concerns
- make an appointment to speak on the phone or in person with the class teacher or Wellbeing Coordinator; ensuring that you inform the school about the issue you wish to discuss
- consider speaking with the school's student wellbeing Coordinator/Leader if you feel that is appropriate
- arrange any meeting times or phone calls through the school office (this is more convenient for both you and your child's teacher and does not interrupt teachers during the time they need to be with their students)

Remember that the class teacher together with others who may be involved, should be given a reasonable amount of time to take the steps required to resolve or address your concerns.

## Consequences of a Breach of Cana's Parent Code of Conduct

Any parent, member of school staff or student may notify the Principal of a possible breach of the Cana Parent Code of Conduct. The Principal will investigate the complaint and if satisfied that a breach has occurred will:

- A meeting may be terminated at any time if there is a breach of conduct
- provide a first and final warning that a breach of the Cana Code of Conduct has occurred and that a further breach will not be tolerated [5]
- issue a trespass warning to the parent if the behaviour was one of an aggressive manner. If the behaviour continues, may accelerate to a trespass notice prohibiting the parent from coming on school grounds for a designated period of time, determined by the Principal or their representative in line with MACS and DET guidelines

## Regular review

This document will be reviewed every year in consultations with parent representatives, and following significant incidents if they occur. We will ensure that families have the opportunity to contribute. Where possible we do our best to work with local Aboriginal communities, culturally and/or linguistically diverse communities and people with a disability.

## Message from Fr. Maurie

### Greetings, everyone!

A group of our young Parishioners at our Sacred Heart School were in the church yesterday for the Prayer Service that they had prepared. We had a 'Q&A' session after that, and our twisted willow symbol intrigued them. Yes, it's sprouting new leaves and pushing out new roots. It is a very good symbol for the passage of the Lenten Season that we are on, and the children seemed to be able to appreciate that.

Their Prayer was titled 'Making Time for God'. That's a valuable reminder for us all, isn't it, with some special emphasis in this Season of Lent: prayer, fasting and good works are the three time-honoured actions for Lent.

A gathering of some of our young people and their families was held during the week. The first celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation for us this year comes at Sacred Heart at the end of next week with our Regional Bishop, Martin Ashe. As part of the preparation for that our families gathered to explore some aspects of the Sacrament. One activity they shared named 'the gifts of the Holy Spirit', and asked families to name the gifts that they see in one another. Then the children enjoyed telling their parents which gifts they saw in them that could do with a bit of improvement!!

Still thinking of our young Parishioners, it has been Catholic Education Week this week. As I have commented before, we are so blessed to have such fine Catholic Schools and Colleges in our Parish, with great Catholic leadership from our Principals and their leadership teams. Catholic Schools are such a significant part of the mission of our Church, as recognised in an attachment with this email.

Another 'week' is coming up next week – it is Harmony Day on Tuesday. Harmony Week celebrates Australian multiculturalism, and the successful integration of migrants into our community. Australia claims to be one of the most successful multicultural countries in the world. The message of Harmony Week this year is 'Everyone Belongs'. It is about inclusiveness, respect and belonging for all Australians, regardless of cultural or linguistic or religious background. Harmony Week asks us to think, talk about and recognise how our differences make Australia a great place to live.

The Australian Bureau of Statistics records (in 2016): more than 70 Indigenous languages are spoken in Australia.; nearly half (49 per cent) of Australians were born overseas or have at least one parent who was; we identify with over 300 ancestries; 85 per cent of Australians agree multiculturalism has been good for Australia; apart from English, the most common languages spoken in Australia are Mandarin, Arabic, Cantonese, Vietnamese, Italian, Greek, Tagalog/Filipino, Hindi, Spanish and Punjabi.

Our Parish and this wider part of Melbourne knows much about this, don't we?

One element in this mix is that the Christian faith was brought to our country by the Irish and English in those years following 1788. When the first Catholic Priest arrived in 1800, there was already a lively Catholic community developed by the people – who has been gathering for reading the Scriptures, praying, and caring for those around them. We celebrate St Patricks feast day today, as do many places around the world where the Irish have spread and made their home. One of the much-honoured prayers that St Patrick gave us is:

#### St Patrick's Breastplate

I bind unto myself today
the power of God to hold and lead,
His eye to watch, His might to stay,
His ear to hearken to my need;
The wisdom of my God to teach,
His hand to guide, His shield to ward;
The word of God to give me speech,
His heavenly host to be my guard.

Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me. Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in quiet, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger.

I bind unto myself the Name, the strong Name of the Trinity, by invocation of the same, the Three in One and One in Three. by Whom all nature hath creation, eternal Father, Spirit, Word. Praise to the Lord of my salvation, Salvation is of Christ the Lord. Amen. This weekend's Lent Gospel Reading tells the story of the blind man whom Jesus brought to new sight. That's part of the goal of Lent, isn't it – to see God and ourselves more clearly. A very demanding prayer of St Francis of Assisi calls for the 'light of God' so that this will happen:

All-highest, Glorious God, cast your light into the darkness of my heart. Give me right faith, firm hope, perfect charity, and profound humility, with wisdom and perception, O Lord, so that I may do what is truly your holy will.

I like, too, Leunig's traveller wanting to find the light that will guide and the light that will caution – see below. "Christ, Be Our Light" as we often sing!

Renewed thanks to all who provide financial support for our Parish: you will have received the new sets of Thanksgiving envelopes by now, and a letter of appreciation to our Direct Debit and Credit Card contributors.

There was a solid response last weekend to the call to sign on for the many and varied Ministry roles needed for our Holy Week-Easter ceremonies. Those clipboards are in the foyers again this weekend for you to fill in the gaps if you can. Times for all the ceremonies at both our churches are listed on the Parish Newssheet that is attached with this email.

### REFLECTION

## REFLECTION: It's not too late to get started!

What a great symbol for this process the 'twisted willow' in our churches is through Lent – having shed its former growth, it is putting out new roots and developing signs of new life! Dropping away some 'old growth' from our lives: and creating space for new life and growth for new ways ahead: that is the call and opportunity of Lent. It's not too late to get started!

This 'conversion' doesn't come from the wave of a magic wand, but from learning to do good through concrete actions every day, Pope Francis has said. Conversion happens through humility and trying to become "better than the day before," the Pope said.

"It is a path, a path of turning away from evil and of learning."

This summarises the Church's longstanding practice of fasting and prayer during Lent: fasting from (i.e. giving up) some thoughts, actions, attitudes that are not Christ-like; praying in a way that listens to the call of Christ to live in His way; and doing things in a new, Christ-like way.

The Pope repeated, "You learn to do good through concrete things. Not with words and good intentions, but with actions." In the gospels, the Pope continued, Jesus reproaches the scribes and Pharisees because they do not put into actions what they preach.

"They do not know concreteness. If there is no concreteness, there can be no conversion," he said. This is the point of this Season. Pope Francis said all Christians are called to embark on "the path of Lenten conversion," knowing that God "is a father who speaks, he is a father who loves us."

"He accompanies us on this path of conversion. He only asks of us to be humble, then our sins all will be forgiven.

#### SCHOOL'S IN!

Muchuch has been happening in our Schools and Colleges already this year of course. Amongst that, our three Catholic Parish Primary Schools and our four Catholic Regional Colleges have included Masses with staffs, planning and celebrating 'Masses at the Opening of the School Year', planning for the Sacraments, heading away for 'retreat' with students, and setting programmes and goals for the year – and beginning to tackle them. We are so proud that our Schools and Colleges are great *Catholic* places!

Catholic Schools are such a significant element of the life of the Church. Our Schools give shape to the experience of Church for so many people in our Parish. Through them our young people and their families can experience what the Church of Jesus Christ is called to be, a community of faith in which all matter and have a place – for growth and life, and where the Gospel is lived.

Of course they are *Schools*! The Canon Law of our Church is straightforward on this: Those who are in charge of Catholic Schools are to ensure that the formation given in them is in its academic standards at least as outstanding as that in other Schools in the area (*Canon Law* 806.2).

Our Parish Primary Schools and our Colleges are fine examples of the Church's role in education!!

- Let us thank all those who teach in Catholic schools. Educating is an act of love; it is like giving life. (Pope Francis)
- The family remains the basic unit of society and the first school in which children learn the human, spiritual and moral values which enable them to be a beacon of goodness, integrity and justice in our communities. (Pope Francis)
- Schools are the principal means of helping parents to fulfil their role in education (Canon Law 796.1).
- Education cannot be neutral. It is either positive or negative; either it enriches or it
  impoverishes; either it enables a person to grow or it lessens, even corrupts him. The
  mission of schools is to develop a sense of truth, of what is good and beautiful. And this
  occurs through a rich path made up of many ingredients. This is why there are so many
  subjects because development is the results of different elements that act together and
  stimulate intelligence, knowledge, the emotions, the body, and so on. (Pope Francis)
- In your school you take part in various activities that habituate you not to shut yourselves in
  on yourselves or in your small world, but to be open to others, especially to the poorest and
  neediest, to work to improve the world in which we live. Be men and women with others
  and for others, real champions in the service of others.

From the Vatican document *The Religious Dimension of Education in a Catholic School*[1988, 1]:

The Catholic School pursues cultural goals and the natural development of youth to the same degree as any other School. What makes the Catholic School distinctive is its attempt to generate a community climate in the school that is permeated by the Gospel spirit of freedom and love. It tries to guide the young people in such a way that personality development goes hand in hand with the development of the "new creature" that each one has become through Baptism. It tries to relate all of human culture to the good news of salvation so that the light of faith will illumine everything that the students will gradually come to learn about the world, about life, and about the human person".
