### **Enrolment - Reminder**



Mass at Cana is celebrated in year levels and occasionally on Holy Days of Obligation we will have whole school masses as we come together as a community to celebrate the Eucharist.


Below are the masses for Term 1. Hopefully you can join us.

Cana Catholic Primary School has a commitment to the care, safety and wellbeing of children.

### Rationale

This Cana Catholic Primary School Parent Code of Conduct outlines the way in which our community requires all parents/carers and family members to conduct themselves when visiting our school, and communicating with students, staff and other parents in our school.

The Cana Catholic PS Parent Code of Conduct applies to all adults including parents, guardians, carers, step-parents, grandparents, extended family while involved in activities or communication related to Cana Catholic Primary School.

The School Policy & Advisory Guide, 'Visitors in Schools' requires all visitors to the school during school hours to sign a visitors' register located at the school office, so that their presence in the school is recorded for Child Safety reasons and in the event of an emergency. (excluding Mass and Interschool Sports)

### When at school and within the proximity of the school

Parents/Carers will:

- use courteous and acceptable language when communicating with their own children, other students, staff and other parents/carers and members of the school community. There will be zero tolerance to any verbal or physical violence towards others.
- value our diverse community and respect the rights and practices of individuals and their families.
- respect points of view that are different from their own.
- firstly, speak directly to the teacher with any concerns regarding incidents in the school. The teacher will then refer the parent to appropriate staff if necessary.
- be mindful of the teacher's time, when wanting to communicate with them. Make a time to meet that does not disrupt the class unless there is a genuine emergency.
- listen respectfully, in the same manner required of students and staff when attending school assembly or informal/formal meetings.
- provide appropriate parental supervision before the bell in the morning and in the afternoon (3.15pm onwards Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday).
- remove their child from a situation that involves any form of violence and seek support from staff members.
- model positive behaviours in front of all students at all times, whether on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- comply with the school onsite parking expectations, with road safety rules and parking signs when dropping off or picking up their children to and from school.
- comply with the Cana Catholic PS Attendance Policy and to use the SkoolBag App. (refer to Cana's website).
- ensure that your child complies with the Cana's School Uniform Policy (refer to Cana website).
- respect all Cana's policies and procedures (refer to Cana's website).
- Respect the privacy of teachers.

### **Unacceptable Behaviour**

Parents/Carers will not:

- discipline a child who is not theirs or speak to a child who is not theirs about that child's behaviour. This is the role of the teaching staff. Being approached by an adult they do not know, can be distressing for children. Common sense would prevail if safety was an issue.
- use offensive language towards their own children, students, staff and other parents/carers and members of the school community when on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- interrupt or distract a teacher while classroom instruction or learning activities are underway.
- engage with staff, students or parents/carers in an aggressive manner regarding issues of a personal or school nature.
- engage in inappropriate physical contact with students, staff or other parents/carers.
- discriminate between or disrespect any member of our school community.
- disrupt the good order of the school by any means including: in person, via persons representing them or social media.
- Engage with a teacher about school matters outside the school environment.

### When making a complaint

Parents have the right to raise issues and concerns related to the education/welfare of their child or other school matters.

There are a number of ways you can raise any concerns you have about your child. You can:

- write a note or email your child's teacher outlining your concerns
- make an appointment to speak on the phone or in person with the class teacher or Wellbeing Coordinator; ensuring that you inform the school about the issue you wish to discuss
- consider speaking with the school's student wellbeing Coordinator/Leader if you feel that is appropriate
- arrange any meeting times or phone calls through the school office (this is more convenient for both you and your child's teacher and does not interrupt teachers during the time they need to be with their students)

Remember that the class teacher together with others who may be involved, should be given a reasonable amount of time to take the steps required to resolve or address your concerns.

### Consequences of a Breach of Cana's Parent Code of Conduct

Any parent, member of school staff or student may notify the Principal of a possible breach of the Cana Parent Code of Conduct. The Principal will investigate the complaint and if satisfied that a breach has occurred will:

- A meeting may be terminated at any time if there is a breach of conduct
- provide a first and final warning that a breach of the Cana Code of Conduct has occurred and that a further breach will not be tolerated
- issue a trespass warning to the parent if the behaviour was one of an aggressive manner. If the behaviour continues, may
  accelerate to a trespass notice prohibiting the parent from coming on school grounds for a designated period of time,
  determined by the Principal or their representative in line with MACS and DET guidelines

### **Regular review**

This document will be reviewed every year in consultations with parent representatives, and following significant incidents if they occur. We will ensure that families have the opportunity to contribute. Where possible we do our best to work with local Aboriginal communities, culturally and/or linguistically diverse communities and people with a disability.

# Message from Fr. Maurie

Hello everyone!

We come into the Fifth – and final - week of Lent this weekend! Yes, the following Sunday will be Palm Sunday, and then the great liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter. Already!!

That makes this a good week for reviewing how our Lent renewal has gone. That's the goal of the Season, isn't it: to recognize that we are people of faith, but not completely yet. We know Jesus Christ, but not altogether yet. We live in the way of the gospels, but not perfectly yet. We are part of the People of God, part of the Body of Christ, but not wholly yet.

The Season of Lent has wanted to focus us on the incompleteness of our lives of faith, and the action of Christ to complete and fulfil us in the life of God. The Season's invitation has been to continue to grow in faith, in knowledge of the Lord, and in action for the sake of the gospel of Christ through the way we shape our lives – shown in our actions and our attitudes.

We can achieve all this, because the grace of Christ renews us – and we will be celebrating that at Easter!

The schedule of times for all our Holy Week-Easter gatherings is included in the Parish Newssheet that is attached with this email, on the doors of our churches, and on the billboards at the churches that will be erected early next week.

If you have cuttings and branches that we can use in our churches on Palm Sunday, bring them to the garage at Sacred Heart church next Friday 31<sup>st</sup> March between 9 and 10am, and they will be prepared for the weekend's Masses.

To 'round out' Lent, we have two LENT PRAYER AND RECONCILIATION SERVICES this week:

**Emmaus**: Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> March at 7.30pm

**Sacred Heart**: Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> March at 7.30pm with the opportunity for the one-on-one form of the Sacrament of Penance.

*Maltese confessions with Fr. Edwin Agius will be at Sacred Heart Church Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> April from 11am – 12pm. Our regular Sacrament of Penance continues in Sacred Heart church on Saturday mornings at 10.30am.* 

As I mentioned last week, some of our young Parishioners will have the Sacrament of Confirmation conferred on them at Sacred Heart this weekend by our Western Region Bishop, Martin Ashe. The Bishop visited these young people during the week. A feature of this group of young Parishioners is that 40% of them have already been Confirmed. That happened at the same time as they were Baptised when they were babies. That's the way it is done in Iraq, and in many parts of the universal Church. They will come forward to the Bishop on Sunday for a blessing to recall the Sacrament they shared in when they were so young. Let's hold them all in our prayer this weekend.

Archbishop Comensosli called the Priests of the Archdiocese together for a 'Clergy Workshops' on Thursday. He named that his priorities for 2023 are to have the Archdiocese and its Parishes 'take a more missionary approach'', plan for a 'formation institute' that will assist in preparation for Sacraments and in leadership development, develop ways for the Archdiocese to be more 'synodal' (where all parts of the Church listen to one another).

There were also presentations about developing new approaches to presenting 'the call to Priesthood', about developing approaches to Ministry to youth and young adults, and about Priests/Parish communities/Schools/Colleges working closely together as colleagues.

While we were in that workshop day, there was a lot of talk about 'listening' in Canberra it seems as further information was given about "the Voice to Parliament". Attached with this email is a reflection by Fr Frank Brennan, Jesuit Priest, on this matter. It is important for us to become informed about it before we are called to vote on it later this year.

This Sunday's Gospel Reading is the story of Jesus bring Lazarus back to life. I wonder what Lazarus thought about that? I wonder how his life was changed, how he lived until he died (again)? The Resurrection of Jesus in which we will share is different from this coming-*back*-to life: sharing in the Resurrection takes us forward into the new experience of life that is the fulfilment that lies ahead. In the meanwhile, consider how you are living now is the call of Lent!

Blessings and greetings to all as we head into this final week of the Season!

### REFLECTION

### **REFLECTION:** LENT COMES TOWARDS ITS CLOSE

LENT is the Season during which we have looked forward to the joy of Easter, the triumph of Christ our Lord over death and over sin; and to our being renewed in His life that we have been drawn into in our Baptism. That is our great joy – that is the foundation of all our hope.

There is another looking forward, which is part of Christian living and one to which we turn our attention also at Easter, the looking forward to heaven, to the time when we shall be totally, wholly with God.

Think of the stories we've had during Lent!! Jesus' time in the wilderness, the confusion of Peter, James, and John on that mountain top; the broken heart of the woman at the well; the blindness of the crowd around the man who came to see clearly – and now the death of Lazarus in this week's gospel. It seems that Jesus does not back away from the difficult cases! He can even, then, participate in our lives no matter what we think of ourselves or what we've discovered during Lent about ourselves. He will renew us again and again as we continue our preparation for Easter!

Remember, too, that Lent pushes us out of the church door and into the world we are part of.

With LENT coming towards its close, we have two **Services of Reconciliation** in our Parish this week: that formal opportunity to name our need for the forgiveness and grace of God, to hear that gift proclaimed for us, and to plan our 'new way'. Each Service will be followed by the opportunity for the First Rite of the Sacrament of Reconciliation – at Emmaus Sydenham at 7.30pm this Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> March; and at Sacred Heart St Albans at 7.30pm on this Thursday 30th of march [The Sacrament of Reconciliation continues to be offered on each Saturday at 10.30am at Sacred Heart church.]

### LENT PRAYER AND RECONCILIATION SERVICES— <u>This week</u>:



#### Fr Frank Brennan SJ: voting on the Voice

What are Catholics to think about the proposed referendum on the Voice to Parliament? During the first year of his pontificate, Pope Francis in his Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium* said:

"An authentic faith – which is never comfortable or completely personal – always involves a deep desire to change the world, to transmit values, to leave this earth somehow better than we found it.

"We love this magnificent planet on which God has put us, and we love the human family which dwells here, with all its tragedies and struggles, its hopes and aspirations, its strengths and weaknesses. The earth is our common home and all of us are brothers and sisters."

Pope Francis then quoted with approval his predecessor Pope Benedict XVI, who wrote in his encyclical *Deus Caritas Est* that "the just ordering of society and of the state is a central responsibility of politics," and that the Church "cannot and must not remain on the sidelines in the fight for justice."

Pope Francis added this observation: "All Christians, their pastors included, are called to show concern for the building of a better world. This is essential, for the Church's social thought is primarily positive: it offers proposals, it works for change and in this sense it constantly points to the hope born of the loving heart of Jesus Christ."

Our recent Australian Plenary Council endorsed the *Uluru Statement from the Heart* and encouraged "engagement with processes for implementing the statement, including local, regional, and national truth-telling efforts."

I suggest ten steps for Catholics inspired by our Catholic social teaching when approaching the forthcoming referendum. I couch these suggestions in terms appropriate for those of us who are not Indigenous.

We are all invited into constructive dialogue. We must strive to listen to community leaders who know what is good for their communities just as those of us who are not Indigenous know what is good for ourselves and our loved ones.

1. Be attentive to the voices of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. Stop telling them what is good for them. Start listening to them. Accept that they know what is good for them, just as we know what is good for us and our loved ones.

Don't expect all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to agree about legal, political and constitutional questions. It's called living in a democracy.

3. Form respectful relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and engage in respectful conversations with those who are your friends.
