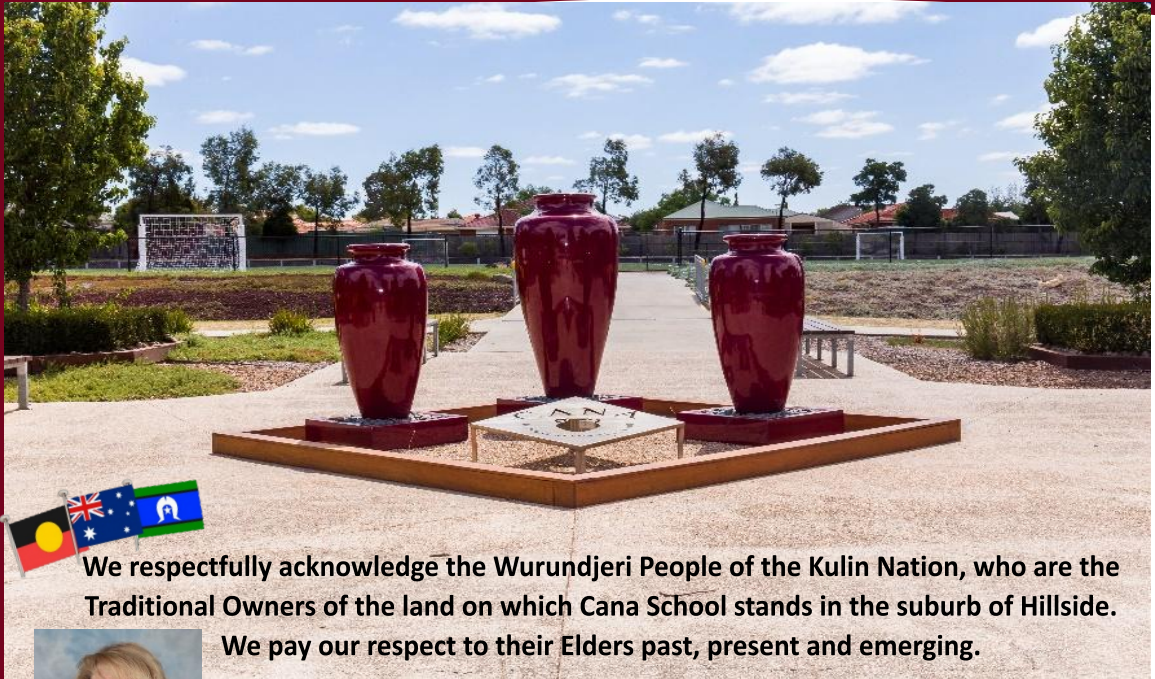

Cana Catholic Primary School has a commitment to the care, safety and wellbeing of children.

Rationale

This Cana Catholic Primary School Parent Code of Conduct outlines the way in which our community requires all parents/carers and family members to conduct themselves when visiting our school, and communicating with students, staff and other parents in our school.

The Cana Catholic PS Parent Code of Conduct applies to all adults including parents, guardians, carers, step-parents, grandparents, extended family while involved in activities or communication related to Cana Catholic Primary School.

The School Policy & Advisory Guide, **'Visitors in Schools'** requires all visitors to the school during school hours to sign a visitors' register located at the school office, so that their presence in the school is recorded for Child Safety reasons and in the event of an emergency. (excluding Mass and Interschool Sports)

When at school and within the proximity of the school

Parents/Carers will:

- use courteous and acceptable language when communicating with their own children, other students, staff and other parents/carers and members of the school community. There will be zero tolerance to any verbal or physical violence towards others.
- value our diverse community and respect the rights and practices of individuals and their families.
- respect points of view that are different from their own.
- firstly, speak directly to the teacher with any concerns regarding incidents in the school. The teacher will then refer the parent to appropriate staff if necessary.
- be mindful of the teacher's time, when wanting to communicate with them. Make a time to meet that does not disrupt the class unless there is a genuine emergency.
- listen respectfully, in the same manner required of students and staff when attending school assembly or informal/formal meetings.
- provide appropriate parental supervision before the bell in the morning and in the afternoon (3.15pm onwards Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday).
- remove their child from a situation that involves any form of violence and seek support from staff members.
- model positive behaviours in front of all students at all times, whether on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- comply with the school onsite parking expectations, with road safety rules and parking signs when dropping off or picking up their children to and from school.
- comply with the Cana Catholic PS Attendance Policy and to use the SkoolBag App. (refer to Cana's website).
- ensure that your child complies with the Cana's School Uniform Policy (refer to Cana website).

- respect all Cana's policies and procedures (refer to Cana's website).
- Respect the privacy of teachers.

Unacceptable Behaviour

Parents/Carers will not:

- discipline a child who is not theirs or speak to a child who is not theirs about that child's behaviour. This is the role of the teaching staff. Being approached by an adult they do not know, can be distressing for children. Common sense would prevail if safety was an issue.
- use offensive language towards their own children, students, staff and other parents/carers and members of the school community when on school grounds or within the proximity of the school.
- interrupt or distract a teacher while classroom instruction or learning activities are underway.
- engage with staff, students or parents/carers in an aggressive manner regarding issues of a personal or school nature.
- engage in inappropriate physical contact with students, staff or other parents/carers.
- discriminate between or disrespect any member of our school community.
- disrupt the good order of the school by any means including: in person, via persons representing them or social media.
- Engage with a teacher about school matters outside the school environment.

When making a complaint

Parents have the right to raise issues and concerns related to the education/welfare of their child or other school matters.

There are a number of ways you can raise any concerns you have about your child. You can:

- write a note or email your child's teacher outlining your concerns
- make an appointment to speak on the phone or in person with the class teacher or Wellbeing Coordinator; ensuring that you inform the school about the issue you wish to discuss
- consider speaking with the school's student wellbeing Coordinator/Leader if you feel that is appropriate
- arrange any meeting times or phone calls through the school office (this is more convenient for both you and your child's teacher and does not interrupt teachers during the time they need to be with their students)

Remember that the class teacher together with others who may be involved, should be given a reasonable amount of time to take the steps required to resolve or address your concerns.

Consequences of a Breach of Cana's Parent Code of Conduct

Any parent, member of school staff or student may notify the Principal of a possible breach of the Cana Parent Code of Conduct. The Principal will investigate the complaint and if satisfied that a breach has occurred will:

- A meeting may be terminated at any time if there is a breach of conduct
- provide a first and final warning that a breach of the Cana Code of Conduct has occurred and that a further breach will not be tolerated ^[1]_[5EP]
- issue a trespass warning to the parent if the behaviour was one of an aggressive manner. If the behaviour continues, may accelerate to a trespass notice prohibiting the parent from coming on school grounds for a designated period of time, determined by the Principal or their representative in line with MACS and DET guidelines

Regular review

This document will be reviewed every year in consultations with parent representatives, and following significant incidents if they occur. We will ensure that families have the opportunity to contribute. Where possible we do our best to work with local Aboriginal communities, culturally and/or linguistically diverse communities and people with a disability.

Message from Fr. Maurie

Greetings to everyone as routines and shapes come back into our lives as Schools and Colleges enter their second term for the year.

The School year affects so much in our lives, doesn't it – traffic, shopping, the role of grandparents, a more relaxed attitude for many of us not directly connected with Schools: I hope you've had some more-than-usual relaxing and enjoyable time over the past fortnight!

We continue in Easter Season, of course – last Sunday's Gospel Reading gave us that great story of 'the road to Emmaus' – with so many layers of meanings in it, culminating in the recognition of the Risen Christ in the Meal of Eucharist, and those two disciples then getting up from Table and going on the mission of spreading the Good News. This leads readily on to this coming Sunday's being called 'vocations Sunday'. Each of us has the vocation to be like those Emmaus disciples and spread the Good News. That is the basic vocation that every one of us has been given in our Baptism, and renewed as we celebrate Eucharist. The particular shape our own life takes doesn't take away the essential nature of that. In preparation for this weekend, Pope Francis reflects on that:

"God's call includes a 'sending.' There is no vocation without mission. There is no happiness and full self-realisation unless we offer others the new life that we have found.

The 60th World Day of Prayer for Vocations will take place on April 30, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, also known as Good Shepherd Sunday.

"This day," Pope Francis said, "is a precious opportunity for recalling with wonder that the Lord's call is grace, complete gift, and at the same time a commitment to bring the Gospel to others."

In his message, he emphasised that the Church's vocations – lay, priesthood, religious, or consecrated life – work together in a harmonious symphony. The vocations are "joined together in 'going forth' to radiate throughout the world the new life of the kingdom of God".

Pope Francis said sometimes the Holy Spirit acts in a completely unexpected way. God's call to a specific vocation is often revealed in a more gradual way.

Love is also a very important part of vocation, the Pope said: "God calls us in love and we, in gratitude, respond to him in love."

Although 'vocation' is for us all, this weekend also calls us to consider that as Church we need more Priests! We don't have enough Priests for the ways we have become used to their presence and service over the years. An example of that came from Brisbane this week:

The Capuchin Friars will withdraw from two inner-city Brisbane parishes in January next year. (Source: *The Catholic Leader*.)

Fr Gerard O'Dempsey OFM Cap, Australian provincial leader of the Friars, said it was his "sad duty" to announce the decision that would affect the parishes of St Mary's, South Brisbane and Dutton Park-West End. We are faced with an ever-aging group of active friars and very few new vocations entering the order."

Brisbane Archbishop Mark Coleridge said the withdrawal announcement came as no surprise - the Capuchins are also withdrawing from Newton parish in Adelaide. Like so many dioceses and religious communities in this country, their numbers are not what they were and they have had to withdraw from some of their missions, he said, thanking the Capuchins for their service.

Archbishop Coleridge said the Capuchin's withdrawal meant the archdiocese would need to "think outside the square in order to imagine new kinds of presence and new forms of mission" for inner-city Brisbane.

Pope Francis has commented on this some time ago: (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 107):

Many places are experiencing a dearth of vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life. This is often due to a lack of contagious apostolic fervour in communities which results in a cooling of enthusiasm and attractiveness. Wherever there is life, fervour and a desire to bring Christ to others, genuine vocations will arise. Even in parishes where priests are not particularly committed or joyful, the fraternal life and fervour of the community can awaken in the young a desire to consecrate themselves completely to God and to the preaching of the Gospel. This is particularly true if such a living community prays insistently for vocations and courageously proposes to its young people the path of special consecration. On the other hand, despite the scarcity of vocations, today we are increasingly aware of the need for a better process of selecting candidates to the priesthood. Seminaries cannot accept candidates on the basis of any motivation whatsoever, especially if those motivations have to do with affective insecurity or the pursuit of power, human glory or economic well-being.

One way our responding to our common vocation is our participation in the various forms of Ministry in our Parish. The re-organising of our groups and the follow-up to ensure all are in compliance with the increasing requirements of the Archdiocese is nearly complete. One further stage is now expected by the Archdiocese. For this, our Safeguarding Committee has arranged a session **Wednesday 24th May @ 7pm**, with tea and coffee from 6:30pm. It is important you make yourself available for this event. The Archdiocese directs all Ministers to participate in this training each 3 years for any role undertaken in the Parish. You must bring your Working With Children Check (WWCC) to obtain a certificate. The event is at CRC St. Albans Hall in Winifred Street. A friendly reminder to all volunteers to ensure you have applied and provided your Working With Children Check to the Parish Office. If you have any problem with online application, call the Parish Office 9366 2146. Once again we appreciate the lengths Ministers go to be a part of the Parish Ministries.

An 'outside-the-box' form of vocation and Ministry is in the attachment with this email: a current way of the Sisters of St Joseph continuing to reach out to and offer care to those who are struggling to make ends meet in the manner of Mary MacKillop.

And this week's Parish newsheet is attached with this email, too.

REFLECTION

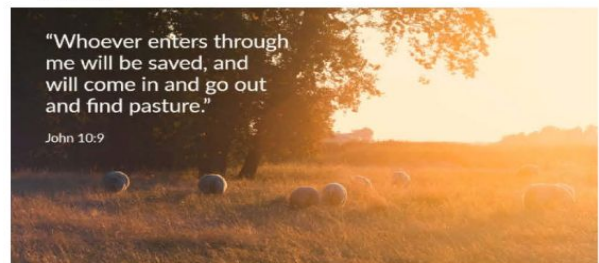
Called to service

All of us are called to 'carry forward the work of Christ under the lead of the befriending Spirit'. This is the basic 'vocation' that every one of us is called to in our Baptism. Whatever shapes our different lives take, that is always the basic vocation. We are all parts of the 'people of God', all parts of 'the Body of Christ'. Each of us has something of the Spirit, none of us has it all as we carry out that mission to 'carry forward the work of Christ'. Each year on this Sunday the gospel Readings give us images of Jesus as 'Good Shepherd', 'the Gate to the sheepfold', leading and enlivening the 'flock of God's people'. With these images this is annually called 'Vocations Sunday' with attention to the 'ordained Priesthood' in our Church. The Parish Priest's role is to celebrate the Sacraments, to preach the Word, to build up the community, to administer the goods of the Parish. It is a good opportunity to recall with thanksgiving those Priests who have been life givers to us and to our Parish communities! Central to that is our gathering for the Eucharist and the other Sacraments: *we need Priests!!*

*Lord Jesus Christ, Good Shepherd,

Interest-free loans program to aid families fighting cost-of-living pressures 26 April 2023



The Sisters of Saint Joseph's interest-free loan program aims to help ease cost-of-living pressures for Australians.

The program allows low-income earners and people receiving Centrelink payments to receive interest-free loans to assist with household financial pressures.

The loans will be available to purchase whitegoods, pay for car registration and repairs, medical expenses, courses and essential household items.

Called the No Interest Loan Scheme (NILS) and administered by Good Shepherd Microfinance, the initiative works on a not-for-profit circular community credit system, where all repayments are used to fund the needs of the next recipient.

While a smaller version of the scheme has been available in rural and regional areas, the program has now been expanded into metropolitan Sydney due to the dire needs of city families facing cost of living pressures.

Eligible applicants can borrow up to \$2000 with a repayment period of up to 18 months, giving them access to essential items so they do not have to live in poverty.

Australian Catholic Bishops Conference spokesperson for families, Sydney Auxiliary Bishop Richard Umbers, said the quiet work of the Sisters of Saint Joseph, through their charitable arm, Mary MacKillop Today, is an exemplar of Christian charity we should all aspire to. "Many Australians are in economic peril, which places an incredible burden on the family unit. I am so proud that our religious orders are there to help those families in need," Bishop Umbers said.

Mary MacKillop Today Financial Inclusion Team Leader Anita Van Dartel said while the program has been assisting people in rural and remote communities for more than 20 years, current economic conditions require it to expand to all areas within Australia. "The fact we're now having to extend our No Interest Loan Scheme to the cities shows just how hard life is getting for Australian families."
