Reminder of Parking and Drop Off Zones



Message from Fr. Maurie

Well hello, everyone!

Yes, after a break since before Christmas – how long ago was that?! – the weekly Parish Letter resumes, like so much else this week as the return to Schools and Colleges marks the 'real' beginning of the year. Whatever the various calendars say, it's this week when our routines and patterns come back into place and will shape us for the months that lie ahead. Those routines take various forms, don't they? Several of our Maltese-background Parishioners have headed off this week to Portarlington – "it's so good down there after the kids have gone back to school!" Work, School and College timetables, traffic,

And Parish life, too. This week we've had gatherings of our Baptism Team and our Ministry of Holy Communion to Aged Care and Private Homes. Our Parish Advisory Group re-gathers next week.

At Masses this weekend we will be 'commissioning' our Ministry of Holy Communion to Aged Care and Private Homes. Following that very successful recruitment project in August last year, our four Teams are now strongly resourced. New members have had their on-the-job training, and have now taken on their roles.

The Gospel Reading for this weekend tells of Jesus' visiting 'the home of Simon and Andrew, with James and John'. This is just after they have come from the synagogue for a Saturday night meal together. Simon's mother-in-law is not well, and experiences the presence of Jesus and new energy enough to get out of her sick bed and prepare the meal for them! What a tribute Reading for our Ministers – taking the presence of Jesus and their own company to the sick, through which they receive new energy, the Ministers themselves as well as the people they're ministering to.

One of the realities of life is sickness, coming to us in many forms. When I am with a sick person, the prayers open with 'Jesus cared for the sick and told his Church to do the same.' Our Church's response is in both our pastoral care and through the Sacraments of Holy Communion and of Anointing of the Sick.

The official Rite for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick says: Great care and concern should be taken to see that those of the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age receive the Sacrament of Anointing. This Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after being anointed and then again falls ill or if during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious; and before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery. Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present. Sick children are to be anointed to be strengthened by this Sacrament. The faithful should not follow the wrongful practice of delaying the reception of the Sacrament. (#8-13)

Unfortunately sometimes the call for this Sacrament is delayed, and the Priest is called only when the person has entered the final journey into death. It is quite moving when the patient is able to participate in the Prayers and Readings. In an emergency situation, there is no time for this sort of planning, of course. Only one aspect of this Sacrament relates to the situation of death though. It is intended to be a continuing comfort and support during an illness, even when indications are that the patient will come through this episode and regain full health.

Care for the sick is a great ministry, at the heart of Jesus' mission as we hear in this weekend's Gospel Reading. If you know of someone who would appreciate a visit, Holy Communion and Anointing at home, contact the Parish Office.

We also have planned a Parish Mass with Anointing for Parishioners – on Friday 23rd February at 10.30 in Sacred Heart church followed by light refreshments. All who would benefit from these Sacraments are most welcome. If you want assistance with getting to the church, contact the Parish Office and we will be able to help.

Another feature that comes into the pattern of the Church's life at this stage is the Season of Lent, commencing this year with Ash Wednesday on 14th February. Masses will be at Sacred Heart at 7.30am and 7.00pm, and at Emmaus at 7.00pm. Lent is that Season where we open ourselves to become more aware of the life-giving presence of Christ in our lives, showing in his compassion, mercy, forgiveness and new life. The time-honoured practices of prayer, fasting and good works come into play in more focussed ways. There will be Stations of the Cross in Sacred Heart church on the Fridays of Lent at 7.15pm. More next week about Lent.

Blessings to all, and for the whole turn of this year that is opening:

As we step into this new year, O God, renew our spirits.
Renew our passion for living and sharing Your wisdom, and nurture our compassion for those in need of greater support.

Transform us as we seek to transform; guide us as we seek to guide; open our minds and hearts as we seek to open minds and hearts to the Good News of the justice and peace Your Son preached.

Help us to listen more deeply to the world and to Your Word, so we can walk with all with Your care, attentive to Your wisdom that calls us onwards and onwards into the Kingdom of God.

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The Child Safe Standards

The safety of each child at Cana is of the utmost importance. It is our duty of care to ensure each child feels safe within all environments including school, home, and the community.

To comply with the Ministerial Order No. 1359 – Implementing the Child Safe Standards, Cana is required to meet the Child Safe Standards 1-11. Below is an outline of each Child Safe standard. More information on each standard can be found here: The 11 Child Safe Standards

<u>Standard 1:</u> To establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued.

<u>Standard 2:</u> Child safety and wellbeing are embedded in organisational leadership, governance, and culture.

<u>Standard 3:</u> Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.

<u>Standard 4:</u> Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.

Standard 5: Equity is upheld, and diverse needs respected in policy and practice.

<u>Standard 6:</u> People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.

Standard 7: Processes for complaints and concerns are child focused.

Standard 8: Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills, and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.

<u>Standard 9:</u> Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.

Standard 10: Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved.

<u>Standard 11:</u> Policies and procedures document how the school is safe for children and young people.

In future editions of the newsletter, each Child Safe Standard will be explored in further detail with examples of how it is implemented at Cana.

Parents we all need to be in partnership and to always be respectful of each other during all interactions - face to face or on social media. We are role models for our children and need to be reflective of our communications and actions.

Child Safety Code of Conduct

Safeguarding Children and Young People Code of Conduct

Acceptable behaviours

All MACS Board members, MACS Board committee members, School Advisory Council members, the Principal and all our other staff, volunteers, contractors, parent community and clergy at Cana are responsible for supporting the safety of children by:

- adhering to the school's child-safe policy and upholding the school's statement of commitment to child safety, at all times
- taking all reasonable steps to protect children from abuse
- treating everyone in the school community with respect
- taking into account the needs of all children and students
- · listening and responding to the views and concerns of children particularly if they are telling you that they or another child has been abused or that they are worried about their safety/the safety of another child
- promoting the cultural safety, participation and empowerment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait
 Islander children (for example, by never questioning an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander child's self-identification)
- promoting the cultural safety, participation and empowerment of children with culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds (for example, by having a zero-tolerance for discrimination)
- promoting the safety, participation and empowerment of children with a disability (for example, during personal care activities)
- ensuring as far as practicable that adults are not alone with a child
- · reporting any allegations of child abuse to the school's leadership (or child safety officer if the school has appointed someone to this role)
- · understanding and complying with all reporting obligations as they relate to mandatory reporting and reporting under the *Crimes Act 1958* (Vic.)
- understanding and complying with all obligations as they relate to the reportable conduct scheme including reporting allegations of reportable conduct in accordance with the school's reportable conduct policy
- · reporting any child safety concerns to the school's leadership (or child safety officer if the school has appointed someone to this role)
- ensuring as quickly as possible that the child is safe if an allegation of child abuse is made

- reporting to the Victorian Institute of Teaching (VIT) any charges, committals for trial or convictions in relation to a sexual offence by a registered teacher, or specific allegations or concerns about a registered teacher
- ensuring they comply with any and all applicable professional or occupational codes of conduct.

Unacceptable behaviours

All MACS Board members, MACS Board committee members, School Advisory Council members, the Principal and all our other staff, volunteers, contractors and clergy at Cana must not:

- · ignore or disregard any suspected or disclosed child abuse. This includes but not limited to physical / mental abuse, neglect and any form of maltreatment by an adult which is threatening to a child.
- develop any special relationships with children that could be seen as favouritism (for example, the offering of gifts or special treatment for specific children)
- exhibit behaviours with children which may be construed as unnecessarily physical (for example, inappropriate sitting on laps)
- put children at risk of abuse (for example, by locking doors)
- · initiate unnecessary physical contact with children or do things of a personal nature that a child can do for themselves (for example, toileting or changing clothes)
- engage in open discussions of a mature or adult nature in the presence of children (for example, personal social activities)
- · use inappropriate language in the presence of children
- express personal views on cultures, race or sexuality in the presence of children
- · discriminate against any child, including because of age, gender, race, culture, vulnerability, sexuality, ethnicity or disability
- · work with children while under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs
- have contact with a child or their family outside school without the school leadership's or child safety officer's (if the school has appointed someone to this role) knowledge and/or consent or the school governing authority's approval (for example, unauthorised after-hours tutoring, private instrumental/other lessons or sport coaching); accidental contact, such as seeing people in the street, is appropriate
- have any online contact with a child (including by social media, email, instant messaging) or their family unless necessary (for example, providing families with eNewsletters or assisting students with their schoolwork)
- · use any personal communication channels/devices such as a personal email account
- exchange personal contact details such as phone numbers, social networking sites or email addresses
- · photograph or video a child without the consent of the parents, guardians or carers
- consume alcohol or drugs at school or at school events in the presence of children.
