**REMINDER TO ALL NEW FAMILIES ABOUT TRAFFIC / PARKING PROTOCOLS** 

During morning drop off we have noticed some families parking in zones that are not authorised. Can you please ensure that you are:

- 1. Not parking in the **Drop Off Zone** or blocking the area with your vehicle.
- 2. All families who are parking onsite, will need to **reverse park** their car into the car space.
- 3. Do not leave any children in the car while they are not supervised.
- 4. This is a one way drive through, the Sandalwood Ave exit must be used when exiting the car park.
- 5. Please do not block the driveway of Sandalwood Ave to drop off your child/ren
- 6. Cana car park is only open in the morning to drop off your child/ren. When picking up your child/ren at the end of day please park your car around allocated car park spaces around the outside of the school. We ask that you please be respectful to the neighbors and pay attention to street signs.
- 7. No blocking of school crossing when dropping off children, in particular back of school on Sandalwood Drive
- 8. Please use the roundabout for ALL U-turns and follow the correct safety traffic rules.

#### Message from Fr. Maurie

#### Hello everyone

Last week we were acknowledging the 'actual' beginning of the year, perhaps with some regret that the easier-going mood of January was passing. Now the routines of life have really 'kicked in', as they say. Our Schools and Colleges have put in two weeks already.

I've always noticed that February may be the busiest month in Parish life: everything gets going again, including those events that may be sometime off in the future, but "let's start talking about them so that we're not caught out later!"

So many positive comments have come in about our 'commissioning' of our Ministry Teams for Holy Communion to those in Aged Care/Nursing Homes and their private homes during Masses last weekend. They do this on our behalf, as I was saying at the Masses: they extend our Parish community life to the residents as well as share the Sacrament through their presence and care.

Remember that I drew attention to our 'Anointing Mass' on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> February in Sacred Heart church at 10.30 followed by tea/coffee and chat. Come along all who would like to benefit from those Sacraments. If anyone needs assistance in getting to the church, contact the Parish Office and we'll arrange for that.

Our Baptism Team will present their Ministry at our Masses this weekend, urgently wanting to build up the numbers in that Ministry. It is an essential part of Parish life – welcoming, supporting, guiding families as they ask for Baptism for their children, for them to be initiated into the life of Christ and the life of the Church. There are several different roles in the Ministry: this might be where you can step forward. This weekend there will be the opportunity to indicate your expression of interest, after which a Team member will discuss that with you.

During the week our Parish Advisory Group met and began to identify some projects we could undertake during the year. Our Parish Finance Committee will meet during the coming week – one task being the finalisation of our Annual Financial Statement which will be forwarded to Archdiocese headquarters (the Archdiocese's financial year is 1<sup>st</sup> January-31<sup>st</sup> December).

The first of our School Masses is celebrated on Friday. The round of meetings of our Primary School Principals and Religious Education leaders and of the Principals of our Colleges gathered for the first time this week.

The year is under way. And with a rush when you notice that in just a few days the Season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday (14<sup>th</sup> February)! It seems to be very early this year, doesn't it? Our Parish Masses on Ash Wednesday will be at 7.30am and 7.00pm at Sacred Heart; at 7.00pm at Emmaus. Our young people will gather in Mass and other forms of prayer at various time of the day, too, sharing in the Ashes.

The Ashes are that symbol that 'things change'. What used to be comes to an end – such as the ways in our lives that don't show up the life of Christ in us but something else instead. With those non-Christ parts of our lives brought to an end in Lent, there's room to come more alive with the life of Jesus – which we will celebrate in Holy Week and Easter (30-31 March).

Lent will call us to take a good look at ourselves. I like very much this quote that I came across in an article about something else – it fits Lent so well:

The real question is whether the 'brighter future' is really always so distant. What if, on the contrary, it has been here for a long time already, and only our own blindness and weakness have prevented us from seeing it around us and within us, and kept us from developing it? (Vaclav Havel, later President of Czechoslovakia, The Power of the Powerless, 1978)

What a great expression of what we will be trying to do through Lent! For 'we already share in the life of God; what that can become we do not know yet' as St John writes in his Letters.

Pope Francis has written quite practically about building strategies for this renewal into our lives. For example on 'fasting', one of those customary practices during Lent along with prayer and good works:

#### FASTING IN LENT

Fast from hurting words and say kind words.
Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude.
Fast from anger and be filled with patience.
Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.
Fast from worries and trust in God.
Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity.
Fast from pressures and be prayerful.
Fast from bitterness and fill your heart with joy.
Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others.
Fast from grudges and be reconciled.
Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.
(Pope Francis based on a Latin prayer)

Project Compassion boxes are available in the foyers this weekend to take home for your donations throughout Lent: they form part of the 'good works' part of the Season.

An extra prayer opportunity during Lent will be 'Stations of the Cross' on Fridays in Sacred Heart church at 7.15pm

Another 'first activity' for the year is our Fair Committee's hosting their first sausage sizzle of the year at Bunnings (Watergardens) this Sunday (11<sup>th</sup>), 9am-4pm. What a huge effort this Ministry group put in throughout each year!! Last year's proceeds of \$7,000 will go to our Parish Primary Schools (Sacred Heart, Emmaus, Cana) when they choose their projects which won't be covered by school fees and grants. The Team do a great sausage – go along and enjoy just outside Bunnings main entrance.

Start considering the Season of Lent, I suggest, so that we 'hit the ground running as soon as it begins. Later in the Season we will gather in Lent Prayer and Reconciliation to call for the renewal the Season and Easter are all about – Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March at 7.30pm at Emmaus, Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> March at 7.30pm at Sacred Heart.

For now: have a good year, have a good Lent!!

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# The Child Safe Standards

The safety of each child at Cana is of the utmost importance. It is our duty of care to ensure each child feels safe within all environments including school, home, and the community.

To comply with the <u>Ministerial Order No. 1359 – Implementing the Child Safe Standards</u>, Cana is required to meet the Child Safe Standards 1-11. Below is an outline of each Child Safe standard. More information on each standard can be found here: <u>The 11 Child Safe Standards</u>

<u>Standard 1:</u> To establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued.

<u>Standard 2</u>: Child safety and wellbeing are embedded in organisational leadership, governance, and culture.

<u>Standard 3:</u> Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.

<u>Standard 4</u>: Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.

Standard 5: Equity is upheld, and diverse needs respected in policy and practice.

<u>Standard 6:</u> People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.

Standard 7: Processes for complaints and concerns are child focused.

<u>Standard 8</u>: Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills, and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.

<u>Standard 9:</u> Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.

Standard 10: Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved.

<u>Standard 11:</u> Policies and procedures document how the school is safe for children and young people.

In future editions of the newsletter, each Child Safe Standard will be explored in further detail with examples of how it is implemented at Cana.

## Parents/Families,

Parents we all need to be in partnership and to always be respectful of each other during all interactions - face to face or on social media. We are role models for our children and need to be reflective of our communications and actions.

# **Child Safety Code of Conduct**

### Safeguarding Children and Young People Code of Conduct

### Acceptable behaviours

All MACS Board members, MACS Board committee members, School Advisory Council members, the Principal and all our other staff, volunteers, contractors, parent community and clergy at Cana are responsible for supporting the safety of children by:

- adhering to the school's child-safe policy and upholding the school's statement of commitment to child safety, at all times
- · taking all reasonable steps to protect children from abuse
- · treating everyone in the school community with respect
- · taking into account the needs of all children and students
- listening and responding to the views and concerns of children particularly if they are telling you that they or another child has been abused or that they are worried about their safety/the safety of another child
- promoting the cultural safety, participation and empowerment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children (for example, by never questioning an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander child's self-identification)
- promoting the cultural safety, participation and empowerment of children with culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds (for example, by having a zero-tolerance for discrimination)
- promoting the safety, participation and empowerment of children with a disability (for example, during personal care activities)
- $\cdot$  ~ ensuring as far as practicable that adults are not alone with a child
- reporting any allegations of child abuse to the school's leadership (or child safety officer if the school has appointed someone to this role)
- understanding and complying with all reporting obligations as they relate to mandatory reporting and reporting under the *Crimes Act 1958* (Vic.)
- understanding and complying with all obligations as they relate to the reportable conduct scheme including reporting allegations of reportable conduct in accordance with the school's reportable conduct policy
- reporting any child safety concerns to the school's leadership (or child safety officer if the school has appointed someone to this role)

- ensuring as quickly as possible that the child is safe if an allegation of child abuse is made
- reporting to the Victorian Institute of Teaching (VIT) any charges, committals for trial or convictions in relation to a sexual offence by a registered teacher, or specific allegations or concerns about a registered teacher
- ensuring they comply with any and all applicable professional or occupational codes of conduct.

## **Unacceptable behaviours**

All MACS Board members, MACS Board committee members, School Advisory Council members, the Principal and all our other staff, volunteers, contractors and clergy at Cana must not:

- ignore or disregard any suspected or disclosed child abuse. This includes but not limited to physical / mental abuse, neglect and any form of maltreatment by an adult which is threatening to a child.
- develop any special relationships with children that could be seen as favouritism (for example, the offering of gifts or special treatment for specific children)
- exhibit behaviours with children which may be construed as unnecessarily physical (for example, inappropriate sitting on laps)
- put children at risk of abuse (for example, by locking doors)
- initiate unnecessary physical contact with children or do things of a personal nature that a child can do for themselves (for example, toileting or changing clothes)
- engage in open discussions of a mature or adult nature in the presence of children (for example, personal social activities)
- use inappropriate language in the presence of children
- · express personal views on cultures, race or sexuality in the presence of children
- discriminate against any child, including because of age, gender, race, culture, vulnerability, sexuality, ethnicity or disability
- $\cdot$  work with children while under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs
- have contact with a child or their family outside school without the school leadership's or child safety officer's (if the school has appointed someone to this role) knowledge and/or consent or the school governing authority's approval (for example, unauthorised after-hours tutoring, private instrumental/other lessons or sport coaching); accidental contact, such as seeing people in the street, is appropriate
- have any online contact with a child (including by social media, email, instant messaging) or their family unless necessary (for example, providing families with eNewsletters or assisting students with their schoolwork)
- · use any personal communication channels/devices such as a personal email account
