

## **Child Safety Code of Conduct**

Safeguarding Children and Young People Code of Conduct

#### **Acceptable behaviours**

All MACS Board members, MACS Board committee members, School Advisory Council members, the Principal and all our other staff, volunteers, contractors, parent community and clergy at Cana are responsible for supporting the safety of children by:

- adhering to the school's child-safe policy and upholding the school's statement of commitment to child safety, at all times
- taking all reasonable steps to protect children from abuse
- treating everyone in the school community with respect
- taking into account the needs of all children and students
- · listening and responding to the views and concerns of children particularly if they are telling you that they or another child has been abused or that they are worried about their safety/the safety of another child
- promoting the cultural safety, participation and empowerment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait
   Islander children (for example, by never questioning an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander child's self-identification)
- promoting the cultural safety, participation and empowerment of children with culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds (for example, by having a zero-tolerance for discrimination)
- promoting the safety, participation and empowerment of children with a disability (for example, during personal care activities)
- ensuring as far as practicable that adults are not alone with a child
- · reporting any allegations of child abuse to the school's leadership (or child safety officer if the school has appointed someone to this role)
- · understanding and complying with all reporting obligations as they relate to mandatory reporting and reporting under the *Crimes Act 1958* (Vic.)
- understanding and complying with all obligations as they relate to the reportable conduct scheme including reporting allegations of reportable conduct in accordance with the school's reportable conduct policy
- · reporting any child safety concerns to the school's leadership (or child safety officer if the school has appointed someone to this role)
- ensuring as quickly as possible that the child is safe if an allegation of child abuse is made

- reporting to the Victorian Institute of Teaching (VIT) any charges, committals for trial or convictions in relation to a sexual offence by a registered teacher, or specific allegations or concerns about a registered teacher
- ensuring they comply with any and all applicable professional or occupational codes of conduct.

#### **Unacceptable behaviours**

All MACS Board members, MACS Board committee members, School Advisory Council members, the Principal and all our other staff, volunteers, contractors and clergy at Cana must not:

- · ignore or disregard any suspected or disclosed child abuse. This includes but not limited to physical / mental abuse, neglect and any form of maltreatment by an adult which is threatening to a child.
- develop any special relationships with children that could be seen as favouritism (for example, the offering of gifts or special treatment for specific children)
- exhibit behaviours with children which may be construed as unnecessarily physical (for example, inappropriate sitting on laps)
- put children at risk of abuse (for example, by locking doors)
- · initiate unnecessary physical contact with children or do things of a personal nature that a child can do for themselves (for example, toileting or changing clothes)
- engage in open discussions of a mature or adult nature in the presence of children (for example, personal social activities)
- · use inappropriate language in the presence of children
- express personal views on cultures, race or sexuality in the presence of children
- · discriminate against any child, including because of age, gender, race, culture, vulnerability, sexuality, ethnicity or disability
- · work with children while under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs
- have contact with a child or their family outside school without the school leadership's or child safety officer's (if the school has appointed someone to this role) knowledge and/or consent or the school governing authority's approval (for example, unauthorised after-hours tutoring, private instrumental/other lessons or sport coaching); accidental contact, such as seeing people in the street, is appropriate
- have any online contact with a child (including by social media, email, instant messaging) or their family unless necessary (for example, providing families with eNewsletters or assisting students with their schoolwork)
- · use any personal communication channels/devices such as a personal email account
- exchange personal contact details such as phone numbers, social networking sites or email addresses
- · photograph or video a child without the consent of the parents, guardians or carers
- consume alcohol or drugs at school or at school events in the presence of children.





#### Message from Fr. Maurie

Greetings to all as the great Season of Lent opens before us!

Very large numbers of Parishioners gathered in our churches on Ash Wednesday to get the Season under way. If you couldn't make it, there will be a bowl of the Ashes in front of the altars at Masses this weekend: come and take some before or after Mass to mark your participation in the journey of Lent to Easter. Throughout the day our Schools and Colleges broke from their routines for prayer and sharing in the Ashes.

It's a great Season of renewal, which we will then celebrate together in Holy Week and Easter. We are people of faith, aren't we, but not completely yet. We know Jesus Christ, but not altogether yet. We live in the way of the gospels, but not perfectly yet. The Season of Lent focuses us on the incompleteness of our lives of faith, with the invitation to continue to grow in faith, in knowledge of the Lord, and in action for the sake of the gospel of Christ. We can achieve all this because the grace of Christ will be renewed in us.

Although Lent can often seem as if 'it's all up to us', the centre of it is that God has shared God's own life with us! In his Ash Wednesday Mass Pope Francis laid out the challenge to us to take some time to acknowledge that reality of our faith even amidst a world that doesn't easily afford us quiet times, personal, private times. 'Go into yourself' he calls, 'come to know God in your life more!' Points from his Homily are attached with this email as an attachment.

That approach doesn't let us off the hook, however. I noticed during the week some words from Pope St Leo the Great (Pope 440-461):

These forty days should be given over to fasting which means not simply a reduction in our food but the elimination of our evil habits. To these sensible and holy fasts we should link almsgiving which under the one name of mercy covers a multitude of praiseworthy deeds of charity. Thus all the faithful, even although unequal to one another in their worldly possessions, should be equal in the drive of their spiritual lives. It is our duty to love both God and those around us and, however we may be hindered in other ways, we are always sufficiently free to wish well to others.

His mentioning 'forty' is a reminder of those other great renewal works of God's over periods of 'forty' – the Flood after which Creation began anew, the years in the desert after which the new Promised Land was reached, Jesus' forty days of fast after which his new form of ministry began. And now our entering our 'forty' – the Season of Lent.

Remember that an extra opportunity for prayer together is the Stations of the Cross each Friday night of Lent in Sacred Heart church at 7.15pm.

What a great response Parishioners gave to our Baptism Team's presentation at Masses last weekend of their Ministry and their call for new participants: seven Parishioners spoke with Team members about becoming part of this Ministry! The next stage is an informal gathering over a cuppa together for an overview of what's involved; and then sitting in on the stages of the Ministry with experienced members of the Team.

Our Ministry to the Sick is hosting a Parish 'Anointing Mass' next Friday, 23<sup>rd</sup> February, at 10.30 in Sacred Heart church. If you feel you could benefit from this, come along. If you or someone you know would need assistance to get there, let the Parish Office know in the early part of the week and we'll organise for that.

Of course we all share in Ministry. As we gather on weekends we are encouraging and supporting one another's faith with our presence and our worship together. In a sense, Lent might be a call to develop in this sense of being important in the community of faith.

And so the Season of Lent has begun. It is a journey we undertake together, with one another and with God's guiding Spirit. It is a journey during which we will be asked to consider how we are people of faith, and to be humble in acknowledging our need to be renewed in the life of Christ. Let us be earnest in our striving for Easter renewal, confident in God's promises of forgiveness, support, encouragement, and new life.

Prayers and blessings for the journey to Easter!

## Pope at Ash Wednesday Mass: Jesus calls us to return to our heart this Lent

At the beginning of Lent, Jesus invites each one of us to "go into our inner room," Pope Francis said in his homily for Mass on Ash Wednesday.

"Going into your inner room," explained the Pope, "means returning to the heart... going from without to within, so that our whole life, including our relationship with God," reflects the reality of our inner being.

The Pope said that Lent offers us the opportunity to "go back" to our authentic selves, removing all the masks and illusions that we too often wear.

This, he said, is why "in a spirit of prayer and humility, we receive ashes on our head"—the ashes remind us we are dust, but dust that is loved and preserved by God: "The ashes placed on our head invite us to rediscover the secret of life" and allow us to feel ourselves to be loved by God "with an eternal love."

#### Called to love our brothers and sisters

The Pope went on to explain that the recognition that we are loved by God will in turn help us to see that we are called to love others in turn.

The traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, he said, "are not mere external practices," but "paths that lead to the heart, to the core of our Christian life."

#### Hearing the voice of the Lord

Pope Francis invited everyone to listen to the voice of the Lord calling us to "go into your inner room," to "return to your heart."

Too often, he said, "we find ourselves no longer having an inner room," especially in a world where everything has become "social." But it is precisely in the secret chamber within each one of us "that the Lord has descended in order to heal and cleanse you."

"Let us enter into our inner chamber," Pope Francis pleaded. "There the Lord dwells, there our frailty is accepted, and we are loved unconditionally."

#### Return to God with all your heart

The Pope concluded his homily with the appeal, "Let us return to God with all our heart!"

He encouraged the faithful during Lent to make time to hear the voice of the Lord in our lives, and to not be afraid "to strip ourselves of worldly trappings and to return to the heart, to what is essential."

Finally, Pope Francis said, "Let us acknowledge what we are: loved by God – and that, thanks to Him, we will be reborn from the ashes of sin to new life in Jesus Christ and in the Holy Spirit."

#### The Child Safe Standards

The safety of each child at Cane is of the ulmost importance. It is our duty of care to ensure each child feels safe within all environments including school, home, and the community.

To comply with the Ministerial Order No. 1359 – Implementing the Child Safe Standards. Cana is required to meet the Child Safe Standards 1-11. Below is an outline of each Child Safe standard. More information on each standard can be found here: The 11 Child Safe Standards

Standard 1; To establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued.

Standard 2: Child safety and wellbeing are embedded in organisational leadership, governance, and culture.

Standard 3: Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.

Standard 4: Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.

Standard 5: Equity is upheld, and diverse needs respected in policy and practice.

Standard 5: People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.

Standard 7: Processes for complaints and concerns are child focused.

Standard 8: Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills, and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.

Standard 9: Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.

Standard 10; Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved.

Standard 11: Policies and procedures document how the school is safe for children and young people.

In future editions of the newsletter, each Child Safe Standard will be explored in further detail with examples of how it is implemented at Cana.
