



NCCD Information Sheet for Parents, Carers and Guardians

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) On School Students with Disability

What is the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data?

Schools must now complete the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) every year. It counts the number of students who receive additional adjustments or "help" at school because of a disability. The NCCD helps governments plan for the needs of students with disability.

Who is counted in the data collection?

To count a student in the NCCD, schools must think through some key questions:

- Is the student getting help at school so that they can take part in education on the same basis as other students?
- Is the help given because of a disability? The word 'disability' comes from the <u>Disability</u> <u>Discrimination Act 1992</u> (DDA) and it can include many students.
- Has the school talked to you or your child about the help that they provide?
- 4. Has the school kept records about the help they provide, the student needs and the reasons that the student needs this help? The school will need to keep copies of tests, student work, assessments, records of meetings, medical reports or other paperwork and information about how the student's learning is moving along over time.

Once the school decides that the student should be counted in the NCCD, they then choose a disability group and one of four levels of help that has been given to the student.

What does the word 'disability' mean in the NCCD?

In the NCCD the word 'disability' comes from the <u>Disability Discrimination Act 1992</u> (DDA). There are four types of disability that the school can choose from: sensory, cognitive, social-emotional and physical.

Many students that need help at school can be counted in the NCCD. For example, students with learning problems, e.g. specific learning disability or reading difficulty (sometimes called dyslexia), health problems (e.g. epilepsy or diabetes), physical disability (e.g. cerebral paisy), vision/hearing loss and social-emotional problems (e.g. selective mutism, Autism Spectrum Disorder, anxiety).

Letters from doctors or specialists can be very helpful for schools as they plan how to support students with their learning. Schools do not need to have these letters before they can count a





Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools.
- · consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. To find out more about these matters, please refer to the <u>Australian Government's Privacy Policy</u>. (https://www.education.gov.au/privacy-policy).

Please be advised that amendments were made to the Australian Education Act 2013 and Australian Education Regulation 2013. Schools are required to inform parents if their child has been included in the NCCD count. As schools are mandated to provide this information to the government, parental consent is not required. If your child has been included in the NCCD count for this year, you will be notified by a member of school leadership in the coming weeks.

Thu Thập Dữ Kiện Nhất Định Trên Toàn Quốc về Học Sinh Khuyết Tật ở Trường (NCCD)

Thu Thập Dữ Kiện Nhất Định Trên Toàn Quốc Về Học Sinh Khuyết Tật ở Trường (NCCD) là gi?

Các trường hiện phải hoàn tất Thu Thập Dữ Kiện Nhất Định Trên Toàn Quốc Về Học Sinh Khuyết Tột ở Trường (NCCD) mỗi nằm, để đếm/tinh số học sinh cần nhận điều chính hay "giúp đờ" thêm ở trường vi bị khuyết tật. NCCD giúp chính phủ các cấp lập kế hoạch cho nhu cầu của học sinh khuyết tật.

Ai được tính trong thu thập dữ kiện?

Để tính một học sinh trong NCCD, các trường cần nghĩ qua một số câu hỏi chính:

- Có phải học sinh ấy cần giúp đỡ ở trường để tham gia học tập theo cần bản như các học sinh. khác hay không?
- Có phải sự hỗ trợ này là do bị khuyết tật hay không? Từ "khuyết tật" trích ra từ Đạo luật Khuyết tật <u>Disobility Discrimination Act 1992</u> (DDA) và có thể bao gồm nhiều học sinh.
- 3. Nhà trường có nói chuyện với quý vị và con về hỗ trợ mà trường đưa ra chưa?
- 4. Nhà trưởng có lưu hỗ sơ về những hỗ trợ dành cho quý vị, về nhu cầu học sinh và lý do học sinh cần nhận hỗ trợ này hay không? Nhà trưởng cần lưu hỗ sơ những bản sao bài kiểm, bài làm của học sinh, tướng trình các buổi họp, báo cáo y khoa hay những giấy tở khác và thông tin về việc học ra sao của học sinh theo thời gian.

Một khi trường quyết định tính một học sinh vào trong NCCD, họ sẽ chọn nhóm khuyết tật và chọn một trong bốn cấp hỗ trợ cho học sinh ấy.

Từ "khuyết tật"có nghĩa ra sao đối với NCCD ?

Trong NCCD, từ "khuyết tật" trích ra từ Đạo luật Khuyết tật <u>Disobility Discrimination Act 1992</u> (DDA). Có bốn loại khuyết tặtmà trường có thể chọn ra: giác quan, nhận thức, cầm xúc- xã hội và thể chất.

Ví dụ như các học sinh gặp khó khẩn trong học tập, v.d bị khiếm khuyết khả năng học hay bị khó khẩn khi đọc (đối khi được gọi là chứng khó đọc Dyslexia), bị vấn đề sức khỏe (v.d bị động kinh hay tiểu đường) khuyết tật thể chất (v.d. bại não) có vấn đề về thị lực / thính lực hay trở ngại về xúc cảm - xã hội (v.d bệnh cầm nhiệm ý , nhiều dạng Rối loạn Tự kỳ , lo âu).

残疾中小学生全国统一数据收集 (NCCD)

什么是全国统一数据收集?

中小学现在必须每年完成,现成中小学生全国统一数据收集。这项活动统计因为残疾而在学校 获得额外调整或新助的学生人数,NCD帮助政府针对线核学生的需求作出规划。

数据收集对象包括哪些人?

如要将学生计入NCD、学校必须充分考虑一些关键问题。

- 学生是否在学校获得推助,以便他们能在与其他学生同样的基础上参加教育?
- 这种帮助是否因为残疾而提供? "残疾"的定义来自<u>(1992年经疾或提法)</u>(IBA)。 可包括很多学生。
- 學校是否會和你或你的孩子讨论过學校提供的帮助?
- 学校是否保存了关于学校提供的帮助、学生的需求以及学生需要帮助的原现的记录? 學校需要保存測试记录,學生作业、评估记录、会议记录、్存报告及其它反映學生 **的学习随时间进展的情况的书面文件和信息。**

学校确定学生应该计入NCD后,就要选择一种残疾类别,以及四个帮助等级中为学生提供的 那一个等级。

NOCD中, "残疾"是什么意思?

NCCD中。"残疾"的定义来自《1982字规度规程法》(BBA)。有四种类型的残疾可供学校选 择,即感官责、认知责、社会、情感类和身体类。

很多在学校需要帮助的学生可以计入NCO。例如,有学习问题(比如特定学习障碍或阅读图 难)、健康问题(比如癫痫或赎尿病)、身体残疾(比如脑瘫)、视觉/听觉丧失以及社会-情感问题(比如选择性缄默症、自闭症遗系障碍、焦虑)的学生。

医生成专家出具的信函对于学校规划如何支持学生的学习会非常有帮助, 学校并非必须有这. 些信誦才能将學生计入NCD。教師可以根据他们对學生學习情况的了解以及在較长时间內收 集的记录决定学生是否应计入NCD。

学校为学生提供哪些类型的帮助?

学生在学校需要各种类型的舞蹈。有些学生只是偶尔需要一点帮助。而有些学生则一直需要 大量帮助、学校提供的帮助类型取决于学生的需求。这些帮助可包括对学校建筑或场地的改

يجب على الدارس الأن استكمال جمع البيانات المشبق وطنيًا هول طلاب المنارس لبري الرعاقة Nationally Consistent على المدارس المنارس المنار

من يتم حصره خلال جمع البيانات؟

حتى يتم مصر الطالب في NCCD، يجب على المترسة أن تفكر في بعض الأسالة الأساسية:

- على يحتاج الطالب إلى المصول على المساعدة في المدرسة ليتمكن من المشاركة في التعليم على نفس الأساس كالطلاب
 الأخدين؟
- على المساعدة التي يتم تقديمها بسبب إعاقة؟ تأتي كلمة "إعاقة" من قانون التمييز بسبب الإعاقة أنعام 1992 ODA) والتي يكن أن للسل الكثير من الشلاب.
 - هل قامت العدرسة بمخاطبتك أو مخاطبة طفاك بشأن المساعدة التي يمكنها تقديمها؟
- 4. هل قامت المدرسة بالاحتفاظ بسجلات حول المساعدة التي قدمتها، واحتياجات الطالب، والأسباب التي يحتاج من أجلها الطالب لثلث المساعدة متحتاج المدرسة إلى الاحتفاظ بنسخ من الاختيارات، أو أعصال الطالب، أو التهيمات، أو سجلات الاجتماعات، أو الثقارين الطبية، أو عيرها من الأوراق والمطومات الخاصة بتطور نظم الطالب بمزور الوقت.

بمجرد أن تقرر المدرسة أن الطالب ينبغي حصره في NCCD، فسيكون عليها تختيار مجموعة إعقة ومستوى واحد من مستويات المساعدة الأربعة التي يتم سلحها للطالب.

ما معنى كلمة "إعاقة" في NCCD"

تكي كلمة "إعاقة" في NCCD من قانون التمييز بسبب الإعاقة تعام 1992 1992 NCCD من قانون التمييز بسبب الإعاقة تعام Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (1992). هذاك أربعة أنواع من الإعاقة يمكن للمدرسة أن تغاثر من بينها: العمية، والإدراكية، والاجتماعية - العاطفية، والبدنية.

يمكن حصر الكثير من الطلاب الذين يختلجون المساعدة في المدرسة في NCCD, على سبيل المثال، الطلاب الذين يعلون من مشاكل في التغيير المثال وعلم معينة أو صحوبة في الغرابة (والتي يطلق عليها أحياناً ديستكسيا dystexia)، ومشاكل صحبة (مثال المسرخ epilepsy أو السكري diabetes)، واعتقة بننية (مثال الشال الدساغي cerebral palsy)، وقفادان المسلم، والمشاكل الاجتماعية - المعلمية (مثال الحرس الانتقالي selective mutism، اسطرابات طيف التوحد (anxiety).

يمكن أن تكون خطابات الأطباد أو المختصين مفيدة جداً للدارس في التخطيط لكيفية دعم الطلاب في عملية التعلم لا تحتاج المدارس للمصول على هذه الخطابات قبل أن تتمكن من حصر الطائب في NCCD. يمكن للمدرسين استخدام كل ما يعرفونه حول تعلم الطاق والسجلات التي قاموا بجمعها على مدار الوقت للوصول إلى قرار بشأن ما إنا كان يمكن حصر الطائب في NCCD.

ما توع المساعدة التي تقدمها المدرسة للطلاب؟

يحتاج الطَّلاب إلى أنواع مختلفة من المساعدة في المدرسة. يحتاج بعض الطّلاب إلى القيل من المساعدة بينما يحتاج طّلاب أخرين إلى الكثير من المساعدة طوال الوقت تغريباً, يحمد نوع المساعدة المقدمة على تحتيلهات الطّائب, يمكن أن تشمل المساعدة تغييرات

Standard 7: Processes for complaints and concerns are child focused.


Standard 8: Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills, and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.

Standard 11: Policies and procedures document how the school is safe for children and young people.
