Welcome back to another week of learning here at Cana. We've had a busy start to the term, but it's been very productive for both staff and students alike. The mixed-up weather continues- students MUST wear their hat each day at school regardless of the weather, however I encourage parents/carers to exercise a common sense approach to students wearing either their summer or winter uniform for another week or so.

As a MACS school principal and at the request of the MACS WRO Senior Manager Lyndon Strong, I had the pleasure of being the principal representative on the interview panel for the principal role at St Catherine of Siena Primary School, West Melton on Friday. I have also been creating possibilities for Cana to work more collegially and collaboratively with neighbouring schools in recent times. These are great opportunities for us to promote Cana within the local community as being a school of choice within the local area. Enrolment demand is huge with there being only very limited vacancies available in some year levels.

Today is World Mission Sunday which is celebrated annually in every Catholic parish around the world. The global church comes together in prayer and solidarity to support mission work in developing communities. Pope Leo has released a <u>video</u> for World Mission Sunday, calling on Catholics around the world to renew their missionary commitment.

October is the Month of the <u>Rosary</u>, whereby as Catholics we are called to focus on the Holy Rosary, a set of prayers in honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Students at Cana have been learning about the Rosary in class, deepening their faith through prayer and meditation. It provides a structured way to reflect on specific events, or "mysteries," from the Gospels and encourages a deeper connection with God.

NDIS providers onsite at school:

Following a review of the NDIA guidelines (who oversee NDIS), the VRQA, the VCEA guidelines for NDIS and external providers and a review of current practices, the school has made the decision not to permit NDIS-funded providers to conduct therapy or observations within the school or classroom settings during instructional time.

This decision is based on the following considerations:

- The NDIS is designed to support participants whole of life
- NDIS does not fund services that are considered reasonable and necessary for participation in education.
- NDIS-funded therapy is not intended to replace or duplicate the responsibilities of the education system, nor is it designed to support educational attainment.
- Schools are not responsible for implementing or delivering NDIS plans. Instead, schools are responsible for providing reasonable adjustments to support student access and participation in education.
- As our school grows in size, we are quickly running out of spaces for these providers to work with children that meet our Child Safety requirements.

We have some emerging concerns regarding classroom access:

- Privacy and consent: Observations conducted in classrooms may inadvertently involve other students and staff, raising concerns about privacy and consent.
- Disruption to teaching and learning: The presence of external providers can draw on the time and attention of classroom teachers, impacting instructional flow.

 Misalignment with curriculum and policy: Therapy or interventions delivered by external providers may not align with MACS policies, curriculum planning, or inclusive education practices.

As outlined in the APTOS Principles (NDIA, pp. 12–13), the allocation of responsibilities between the NDIS and schools must respect:

- The compulsory nature of schooling and legislated instructional hours.
- Schools' obligations under the Disability Standards for Education to provide reasonable adjustments.
- The need for curriculum integrity, assessment, and reporting.

While collaboration between schools and NDIS providers is encouraged, it must occur in ways that do not interfere with classroom instruction or compromise the learning environment. We have therefore decided to stop access from NDIS providers at school. In rare circumstances where non-educational therapy cannot occur at home, it will occur outside of instructional time, where appropriate and in alignment with school policies.

It is not discriminatory to restrict NDIS provider access to schools. Decisions regarding whether external providers may be onsite—and the conditions under which they may operate—are at the discretion of the principal. These decisions are guided by the school's duty to protect student privacy, maintain the integrity of the learning environment, and ensure alignment with educational policies and practices.

I acknowledge that this may be an inconvenience for some families, and I am sympathetic to this. However I must act in accordance with my duties and responsibilities to the entire school community. This decision will take effect from the beginning of the 2026 school year. I encourage parents/carers to communicate this information with their NDIS provider in order to begin making alternative arrangements. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.
